The United States will impose tariffs on the countries that "harm" America, President Donald Trump has said, as he named China, India and Brazil as high-tariff countries.

"We're going to put tariffs on outside countries and outside people that really mean harm to us. Well, they mean us harm, but they basically want to make their country good," Trump told House Republicans at a Florida retreat on Monday, the first after he became the president for the second term last week "Look at what others do China is a tremendous tariff maker, and India and Brazil and so many other countries. So we're not going to let that happen any longer because we're going to put America first," he said.

He said that the US will establish a "very fair system where money is going to come into our coffers and America is going to be very rich again", adding that it will happen "very quickly"

Trump underscored that it was time for the US to return to the system that made it "richer and more powerful than ever before."

Referring to his inaugural speech last week, Trump said: "Instead of taxing our citizens to enrich foreign nations, we should be tariffing and taxing foreign nations to enrich our citizens.

'Under the American first economic model, as tariffs on other countries go up, taxes on American workers and businesses will come down and massive numbers of jobs and factories will come home, he said Earlier, Trump has already

talked about slapping "100 per cent tariffs" on the BRICS grouping, a bloc that includes India as well.

During his address, Trump asked companies to come and set up manufacturing units in the US if they wished to avoid tariffs.

'If you want to stop paying the taxes or the tariffs, you have to build your plant right here in America. That's what's going to happen at record levels. We're going to have more plants built in the next short period of time than anybody before ever envisioned because the incentive is going to be there because they have no tariff whatsoever," he said. The president said that the US support companies building plants in America, particularly in industries like pharmaceuticals, semiconductors, and steel. Trump added that his

administration would also be placing tariffs on steel, aluminium, copper and other materials required by the US military. "We have to bring production back to our country. There was a time when we made one ship a day, and now we can't build a ship We don't know what the hell we're doing. It's all gone to other locations and other lands," he said.

To further return production to the United States, we're going to environmentally free up our rare earth minerals. We have some of the best rare earth anywhere in the world, but we're not allowed to use it because the environmentalists got there first," said the president in his address.

Digital platform has become the primary battleground for political messaging, overshadowing traditional forms of campaigning for the

February 5 Delhi assembly poll. An analysis conducted by The Pioneer highlights the increasing reliance on digital reach by these political parties, with the BJP leading the charge in terms of spending on platforms like Facebook,

Google, and YouTube. Sources aid BJP has allocated substantial funds to advertise their messages, using a combination of videos and images to creatively reach the electorates. On targeted Facebook, the BJP has spent a

whopping Rs 2,58,34,976 over 30 days, from December 26 to January 24, according to Google Transparency Report. This expenditure covers around 863 advertisements, which includes a diverse mix of content ranging from short, impactful videos to visually compelling image posts.

Trailing behind advertising, AAP spent Rs 77,80,887 on 625 advertisements, while Congress followed suit with a more modest expenditure of Rs 23,22,372 across 49

The competition doesn't stop at Facebook. On YouTube, a platform widely used in India, political ads have become ubiquitous ahead of the state elections, which are scheduled to take place on February 5. The BJP once again took the lead in terms of spending, shelling out Rs 4,34,15,250 between December 1 and January 27 for 505 YouTube ads. On January 25 alone, the BJP spent Rs 27,40,000. followed by Rs 24,60,000 on January 12, and Rs 23,30,000 on January 11. Through these ads, the BJP is deploying a variety of creative approaches to capture the attention of voters.

The newly-constructed building near Oscar Public School collapsed late on Monday. So far, 12 people have been rescued and five bodies retrieved from the debris, they

The victims have been identified as Saadhna (17) and seven-year-old Radhika. The other three persons -- all men -- are yet to be identified, they added.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (North) Raja Banthia said a rescue operation was underway and more people could be trapped under the debris.

In a statement issued on Monday, the Delhi Police said it received information about the collapse around seven pm. The building was a new construction spread over 200

Government school enrolment back to pre pandemic levels | Five Indian fishermen injured by

The Annual Status of LEducation Report (ASER) released on Tuesday has indicated an increase in government school enrolment seen during the COVID-19 pandemic seems to have reversed, with the proportion of children aged 6-14 years enrolled in gov-ernment schools nearly back to the 2018 levels.

The report also noted that not only there has been a full recovery from the pandemicinduced learning loss, the learning levels in the primary grades are higher than past levels in some cases. The crucial report found that more than 82 per cent children in the 14-16 age group know how to use a smartphone but only 57 per cent of them use it for educational purposes.

"The increase in government school enrolment seen during the COVID-19 years seems to have reversed. Private school enrolment has been steadily rising since 2006 in rural India. The proportion of 6–14-yearolds enrolled in private schools rose from 18.7 per cent in 2006 to 30.8 per cent in 2014 and stayed at that level in 2018. "During the pandemic years, there was a big jump in gov-

ernment school enrolment with the proportion of 6-14-yearold children enrolled in government schools rising from 65.6 per cent in 2018 to 72.9 per cent in 2022. This number s back to 66.8 per cent in 2024. This almost complete reversal back to 2018 levels is seen across grades as well as gender, and is not particularly surprising given that the economy has

"At the all-India level, the proportion of children in Class 3, who are able to read at Class 2 level, rose slowly from 23.6 per cent in 2014 to 27.3 per cent in 2018 and then fell drastically to 20.5 per cent in 2022. Two years later, we have a full recovery with the proportion of Class-3 children reading flu-

ently at 27.1 per cent.

"We see a similar picture in Class 4, with the proportion of Class-5 children who can read a Class-2 level text rising from 48 per cent in 2014 to 50.5 per cent in 2018, then falling to 42.8 per cent in 2022 and finally recovering to 48.8 per cent in 2024," the report said. For the first time, the nationwide household survey had a section on digital literacy, which applied to older children in the 14-16 age group. It included self-reported questions on access, ownership and use of smartphones, as well as a one-on-one assessment of some basic digital

The report said "82.2 per cent of all children in the 14-16 age group reported knowing how to use a smartphone. Of these, 57 per cent reported using it for an educational activity in the preceding week, while 76 per cent said that they had used it for social media during the same period".

The report found that the proportion of "underage" children (aged five years or below) in Class 1 is decreasing over time. "In 2018, this figure was 25.6 per cent, in 2022 it stood at 22.7 per cent and in 2024, nationally, the percentage of underage children in Class-1 was at its lowest ever at 16.7," it said.

SC asks Centre's stand after woman wants to be governed by succession law

 $T^{ ext{he Supreme Court (SC) on}}_{ ext{Tuesday asked for the}}$ Centre's stand on a Muslim woman's plea seeking to be governed by the Indian succession law instead of Shariat. The plea of Safiya P M, general secretary of "Ex-Muslims of Kerala", and hailing from Alappuzha, came up before a bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justices Sanjay Kumar and K V Viswanathan.

Solicitor general Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, said the plea raised an interesting question. "The petitioner lady is a born Muslim. She says she does not believe in Shariat and she thinks it is an regressive law," he said.

"This will," observed the bench, "run across faith. You will have to file a counter affidavit.' Mehta sought three weeks to take instructions and place on record a counter affidavit.

The bench granted four weeks and said the matter would be heard in week beginning May apex court sought responses from the Centre and the Kerala government on the plea.

The petitioner said though she has not officially left Islam, she was a non-believer and wanted enforcement of her fundamental right to religion under Article 25, saying it must include "the right not to believe" as well.

She also sought a declaration that the persons who didn't wish to be governed by the Muslim personal law must be allowed to be governed by the "secular law of the country" -the Indian Succession Act, 1925 -- both in the case of intestate and testamentary succession.



advocate Prashant Padmnabhan, said Muslim women were entitled to onethird share in the property under the Shariat laws.

The lawyer said the declaration that the petitioner was not governed by the Muslim personal law had to come from the court, or else her father would not be able to give more than one-third of the property.

The top court had permitted Safiya to amend the petition suitably to challenge the Indian succession law and other provisions for excluding Muslims. "Fundamental right to religion Constitution must include the right to believe or not to believe, as per the judgment of this in Indian Young Lawyers Association v. State of Kerala (Sabarimala case)... To have meaning for that right, the person who leaves her faith should not incur any disability or a disqualification in matters of inheritance or other important civil rights," the plea said. Pointing out wide ramifications across the country, the plea urged the bench for an

intervention. It said the pending case in the Supreme Court was for all Muslim women but the present born Muslim and wanted to added.

"As per Sharia law, the person

who leaves her faith in Islam, will be ousted from her community and thereafter she is not entitled for any inheritance right in her parental property," the plea argued.

The petitioner expressed apprehension over the application of the law in the case of her lineal descendant, her only daughter, if she officially left her religion. Seeking a declaration that the Muslim personal law shouldn't govern her for any of the matters listed in Section 2 or 3 of the Muslim Personal Law (Shariat) Application Act, vision either in the Act or in the rules wherein she can obtain such a certificate.'

The plea said there was a "clear vacuum" in the statute which could be plugged by judicial interpretation.

'As of now, the petitioner will not be governed by the secular laws of the country, viz, the Indian Succession Act even if she officially gets a no-religion, no-caste certificate from any authority," said the plea.

Police can't serve accused notice via electronic means: SC

The Supreme Court has said I police cannot serve notices to accused persons through WhatsApp or other electronic modes under the Criminal Procedure Code or Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. A bench of Justices M M Sundresh and Rajesh Bindal directed all states and union territories (UT) to issue appropriate directions to police for issuing notices under Section 41A of CrPC, 1973 or Section 35 of BNSS, 2023 only through the mode of service permitted under the law.

"All the States/UTs must issue a standing order to their respective police machinery to issue notices under Section 41-A of CrPC, 1973/Section 35 of BNSS, 2023 only through the mode of CrPC, 1973/BNSS, 2023," the bench said on January 21.

The top court went on, "It is made amply clear that service of notice through WhatsApp or other electronic modes cannot be considered or recognised as an alternative or substitute to the mode of service recognised and prescribed under the CrPC, 1973/BNSS, 2023.'

The direction came when the court accepted a suggestion by senior advocate Sidharth Luthra, appointed amicus curiae in the matter. Luthra flagged instances where a notice under Section 41-A of CrPC, 1973 was sent through WhatsApp, but the accused did not appear before the investigating officer.

At the heart of the Mahakumbh lies a unique tradition of selfless service-community kitchens, or bhandaras, feeding millions of pilgrims daily. These kitchens, run by religious organizations, ashrams, and private groups, ensure no visitor goes hungry, offering everything from tea at dawn to wholesome meals at night-all free of cost. The hospitality is unmatched. Volunteers lovingly invite passersby to sit and eat, creating an atmosphere of camaraderie

and devotion. In every corner of Kumbh City, at least one bhandara is always open, ensuring constant access to food.

"I came here with just enough money for travel, but these

kitchens made sure I did not have to worry about food," said Gopal Das, a pilgrim from Madhya Pradesh

"The meals are simple but so tasty, and the love with which they're served makes it even more special.

Organizations like Anand Bhawan Seva Samiti from Gujarat serve up to 10,000 people on regular days and over 15,000 on special occasions like the Amrit Snan.

"Feeding pilgrims is part of our devotion. It feels like we are serving God Himself through them," said Rajendra Thakur, a volunteer with the Samiti.

The meals, which typically include lentils, rice, vegetables, and khichdi, are prepared in spotless kitchens where hygiene is paramount. "We ensure all ingredients are stored securely,

and even the dough is kneaded by machines to maintain cleanliness," added Thakur.

For many pilgrims, these meals are more than sustenance-they are a moment of joy and gratitude. "I never imagined eating sweets like barfi and jalebi at a free kitchen," said Rukmini Devi, a first-time visitor from Bihar. "It is like a blessing"

blessing." To ensure environmental responsibility, many kitchens use disposable plates made from biodegradable materials like leaves, while others rely on reusable steel or plastic plates. At large kitchens like Anand Bhawan diners themselves Bhawan, diners themselves wash their plates as a gesture of devotion. "It feels like being part of a family," said Prakash Mishra, a pilgrim from Uttar

Pari Akhara's fight for separate Amrit Snan for women saints reaches Allahabad High Court

The long-standing demand for a separate Amrit Snan (royal bath) for women saints at the Maha Kumbh has taken a legal turn, with Pari Akhara filing a petition in the Allahabad High Court. The petition challenges the lack of representation for women in the traditional system of akharas (religious orders), questioning why there are 13 recognized akharas exclusively for men but none dedicated to women.

Pari Akhara, which was founded in 2013 by female saint Trikal Bhavta, has been advocating for gender-specific arrangements in the Kumbh Mela. Despite receiving government support in previous Kumbhs in Haridwar, Nashik, and Ujjain, they were not granted permission for a separate Amrit Snan. This year, the Pari Akhara has renewed its efforts for inclusion in Prayagraj Maha Kumbh.

Akhara have been vocal about their demand. Recently, they held discussions with senior figures, including the head of Niranjani Akhara, Acharya

Mahamandaleshwar Swami Kailashanand Giri, and the Chief Patron of Juna Akhara, Swami Hari Giri, However, these talks failed to yield a resolution.

yield a resolution.
Faced with opposition from the established 13 akharas, Pari Akhara turned to Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, but their plea resulted in mere assurances. Left with no other option, the group filed a petition in the Allahabad High Court on January 2, urging the court to mandate separate royal bathing arrangements for women saints. The petition has created ripples within the religious ripples within the religious community, sparking debates about gender inclusivity in the age-old tradition of Kumbh Mela.

The 13 recognized akharas in India In the ongoing Maha Kumbh, are divided into three sects: Shaiv





(three akharas), and Udasi (three akharas). These akharas hold immense sway over Kumbh Mela rituals and receive special government facilities. Pari Akhara, despite its efforts, has not been officially recognized by the Akhara Parishad, the apex council formed in 1954 to oversee the functioning of these orders. Speaking on the issue, Akhara Parishad President Ravindra Puri

reiterated that only the 13 established akharas are recognized. He stated, "Women saints are respected in all akharas, and many including

of them, including Mahamandaleshwars, are part of the existing akharas. No new akhara

the existing akharas. No new akhara can be granted recognition."
Saint Trikal Bhavta, founder of Pari Akhara, emphasized that the fight for separate Amrit Snan is symbolic of the struggle for gender equality within religious traditions. "Thousands of women saints from India and abroad are associated

participate in a separate royal bath during the Prayagraj Maha Kumbh. We have faith in the court to deliver justice," she said. Acharya Mahamandaleshwar Jagriti

Chetna Giri of Pari Akhara added, "This is a fight for the very existence of women saints in religious traditions. We are raising our voices at every level and have received assurances of support from several senior saints. We hope for an expedited hearing so women saints can achieve their rightful place in the Prayagraj Maha Kumbh."

The issue has ignited a larger debate about inclusivity and equality in religious practices. As the Allahabad High Court deliberates on the petition, the demand for a separate Amrit Snan for women saints has already stirred the traditional structures of the Kumbh

Seven dead and over 50 injured as platform collapses during religious event

ragedy struck the Jain Community in Baraut, Baghpat, during their annual 'Laddoo Mahotsav' on Monday when a bamboo platform erected at a temple collapsed under the weight of hundreds of devotees. The incident claimed six lives and left over 50 injured.

According to the police, the platform was built for devotees to offer laddoos as part of the religious observance commemorating the nirvana of Jain deity Adinatha. As the priests and devotees gathered on the structure, it gave way, leading to chaos. Baghpat police chief Arpit injured were rushed to serious

District Magistrate Asmita Lal confirmed the annual nature of the festival, which has been observed by the local Jain community for three decades. "The wooden structure collapsed, leaving about 40 people injured. Twenty have already been treated and sent home, and remain under

medical care," she said. Eyewitness Rakesh Jain, a devotee present at the event, described the harrowing scene. "The platform is set up every year for the priests and devotees to offer laddoos. This time, it couldn't bear the weight of the crowd, and it collapsed suddenly," he said.

People pelt stones at special train for Prayagraj

Harpalpur, Uttar Pradesh: A special train traveling from Jhansi to Prayagraj for the Mahakumbh came under attack when agitated passengers at Harpalpur station pelted it with stones. The incident caused widespread panic among passengers as windows were shattered, and the train was damaged.

Videos circulating on social media show passengers screaming in fear as stones were thrown at the train. In one video, a passenger recounts, "The train left Jhansi for Prayagraj around 8 pm. When it reached Harpalpur, it was attacked. The windows were broken, and stones were hurled inside, endangering the lives of passengers, including women and children."

The train, part of a special service organized to ferry devotees to the Mahakumbh in Prayagraj, drew large crowds. Many passengers at Harpalpur, about two hours from Jhansi, were waiting to board the train but found the compartment doors locked. Their frustration reportedly escalated into violence, with the crowd throwing stones and shattering

Pushpak Sharma, in-charge of Harpalpur police station, confirmed the attack. "The train reached Harpalpur station around 2 am, and some individuals in the crowd started throwing stones at it," he said. Railways spokesperson Manoj Singh explained that a large number of passengers had gathered on the platform, eager to board the train. "When they found the compartment doors locked, they became agitated and created an uproar. The situation escalated into stonepelting," he said.

Railway police intervened quickly, dispersing the crowd and calming the situation. The train resumed its journey after a brief halt. "We appeal to passengers to remain patient and cooperate for a smooth journey to Prayagraj," Singh added. "Special trains are being operated to accommodate the large number of visitors for the Mahakumbh, and such incidents disrupt services and jeopardize safety."

Authorities are investigating the incident and have assured enhanced security measures at railway stations along the route to prevent a recurrence of such

Recalibrating US-India ties



Trump's America: A

reality check for the Desis _



t's not Elon Musk's early frustrations with President Donald Trump handing over the crucial project to build America's AI (Artificial Intelligence) infrastructure to rival Sam Altman-led 'Stargate', that ought to worry us, but the fate of fellow Trumpeteer, Vivek Ramaswamy, that rings closer home. During the campaign trail, the racist Trump was busy mocking minority ethnicities and religions, the Indian-American Desis, seemed smug in assuming that somehow, they were a cut above the other minorities. Soon thereafter Trump kept peppering his Make-America-Great-Again (MAGA) spiel with threats of tariff spikes against traditional allies like Canada, Denmark, Mexico etc., (including naming India) but recently suggested that he'd 'rather not' impose tariffs against China – this after promising up to 60% tariffs against China during the campaign! imulation refers to the imitation of real-world Oprocesses or systems for training, education, or evaluation purposes. In emergency medical learning, simulation creates realistic scenarios that replicate medical emergencies, allowing healthcare providers to practice and refine their skills in a safe, controlled environment. The implementation Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) by the National Medical Council (NMC) has shown that simulation significantly enhances clinical competence for both undergraduate and postgraduate medical students.

One of the most significant advantages of simulation is that it enables learners to practice handling critical and high-stakes situations without risking patient safety. This is particularly important in emergencies, where errors can have severe consequences. By engaging in simulated scenarios, participants can repeatedly practice emergency protocols, improve technical skills such as intubation and defibrillation, and gain confidence in their abil-



Simulations replicate the high-pressure environment of real emergencies, helping pressure individuals develop the ability to make rapid, informed decisions under stress. They also provide a risk-free setting to identify and correct mistakes, enabling participants to learn how to prevent such errors in real-life situations. Additionally, exposure to diverse scenarios prepares learners to adapt to unexpected complications effectively. Teamwork plays a critical role in emergency medical training, and simulation emphasises the importance of

collaboration and communi-

cation. Learners develop skills

in articulating observations,

providing updates, and con-

veying instructions clearly, which are essential in highsituations. Simulation allows team members to define roles, such as team leader or airway manager and practice seamless coordination. Through repeated practice, team-based simulations foster trust, cohesion, and an understanding of each member's strengths, weaknesses and working

Structured debriefing sessions after simulations promote a culture of continuous learning by encouraging open discussions about successes and areas for improvement. These sessions help build leadership and followership skills, enabling team

leaders to hone their abilities while fostering supportive and adaptive team dynamics. The benefits of simulation extend to faster and more efficient responses in real emergencies, reduced stress and burnout for healthcare providers and improved patient care outcomes. Familiarity with high-stakes scenarios enables teams to act cohesively and manage stress more effectively, ensuring better results in critical situations

Simulation learning is an essential tool for building individual competence and strengthening medical teams. In a field where zero-error tolerance is crucial, particularly in emergency departments, simulation-based learning equips medical stu-dents with both confidence and competence. The future of medical education lies in recognising the importance of practical skills alongside theoretical knowledge, making simulation a cornerstone of training programmes.

DeepSeek was reportedly developed at a fraction of the cost of its competitors, raising questions about the future of America's AI dominance and the scale of investment planned by US firms.

AI leader \dot{N} vidia's share price sank 17 per cent, and it lost about \$593 billion in stock market value, according to market experts, the biggest one-day loss ever for a company on Wall Street. I was won-dering if Mr. Trump, who has just given a 75-day extension to China's app TikTok, will be able to show his displeasure with China and announce a 100 percent import duty on it instead of 60 percent. But it doesn't seem that Trump will be able to deal with China the way he deals with Mexico and Colombia. That's why he has refrained from imposing the previously announced 60 percent import duty. On the contrary, he is advising his American tech companies that 'this is a wake-up call for you guys." Despite limited access to advanced hardware, DeepSeek's ability to compete with American models shows that software simplicity and data efficiency can compensate for hardware constraints, and underestimating China in any field can be a cause of embarrassment for any-

With the Union Budget 2025 at the stage of finalisation, it is time to prioritise health

Allocating funds to this cause is not merely an educational reform; it is an investment in India's future. It is stated time and again, including in the National Education Policy, that it is critical to allo cate public investment in education from the current over 4.5 per cent to about 6 per cent of total budgetary allocation. Besides this, the Government must consider designing schemes that ensure health education is imparted to children at an early stage to be able to build a healthy society. Development is not merely economic or technological it is also social, cultural and, above all, human.

A nation's progress depends on the health of its people, and with over 40 per cent of India's population under 25, ensuring the health and wellbeing of its youth is critical. This cannot be achieved without systematically integrating health education into our school curricula. Our goal is to improve student's health knowledge and more importantly, their health behavior. The urgency for such an intervention is rooted in troubling realities. Studies indicate that 30-40 per cent of Indian students face serious mental health challenges. A Global School

Health Survey (GSHS) conducted as far back as 2007 revealed that more than 25 per cent of students aged 13-17 experienced periods of deep sadness or hopelessness, often disrupting their daily activities. These numbers have only worsened in the years since, as highlighted by small-scale studies and the alarming rise in student suicides. Ignoring the mental and physical health of students today will lead to grave consequences for the nation tomorrow.

The contrast between India and nations that give primacy to health education is stark. In the United States, the Youth Risk Behaviour Survey (YRBS) collects data every two years on the health behaviours of high school students. This data informs evidence-based intervenpolicies that address mental health, substance abuse, nutrition, and other critical issues. Many US states mandate health education, covering mental, physical, and social health literacy. Similarly, countries like the United Kingdom and Canada have integrated health education into their school curricula, starting at the primary level.

India, however, lacks a comprehensive approach. While physical education is emphasised in schools, the broader concept of health education, encompassing mental and social wellbeing, is largely absent. The much-lauded National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 only touches upon physical health, failing to address the critical need for a holistic health education framework. Why does this matter? Because healthy individuals contribute to a healthier economy. Poor health not only

reduces productivity but also pushes families into financial crises due to high medical expenses. India's average life expectancy in 'full health' is a mere 60 years, significantly lower than that of many

Asian countries, including Japan (74 years) and China (69 years). A healthy lifestyle, ingrained early, can change this trajectory. Countries like Japan provide valuable lessons. Their emphasis on hygiene, nutrition and physical activity is embedded in their cultural fabric. Children grow up practising these habits, resulting in a population that enjoys a higher quality of life and longer years of productive health. India, with its rich traditions of

yoga and Ayurveda, has the cultural foundations to promote such a snift. However, without institutionalising health education, these remain underutilised. Introducing health education as a mandatory subject in schools can address this

A comprehensive curriculum must include modules on physical fitness, mental health resilience, nutrition, social interaction and technology use. For instance, students could learn the importance of balanced diets, strategies to cope with academic pressure, and the benefits of physical activities and mindfulness practices.

The curriculum should also emphasise practical life skills, such as decision-making, interpersonal communication, and self-advocacy, to prepare students for realworld challenges. A structured approach is essential. First, the government must design a standardised health education curricu-

benchmarks. Students' progress should be evaluated at key stages, such as the end of classes 6, 8, and 10. Second, teachers need specialised training to effectively deliver this curriculum. Public-private partnerships can play a crucial role in addressing resource gaps and providing innovative solutions.

Importantly, this initiative aligns seamlessly with the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Viksit Bharat 2047. A healthy India is a productive India. By equipping the younger generation with the knowledge and skills to prioritise their wellbeing, we are not only improving individual lives but also strengthening the nation's human capital, driving economic growth, and enhancing societal nappiness.

Beyond the classroom, the ripple effects of mandatory health education can be transformative. A population that understands the value of preventive care will reduce the burden on India's healthcare system. Families will adopt healthier lifestyles, and communities will benefit from reduced rates of lifestyle-related diseases, such as diabetes, hypertension, and heart ailments.

The road to Viksit Bharat 2047 is paved with initiatives that prioritise people over policies, and action over aspirations. Health education is not just a subject; it is a foundation for a stronger, healthier, and more prosperous

How restoring forests can combat climate change and empower communities

Reforestation stands as both a climate action imperative and a cornerstone for building sustainable future

mid escalating climate changes, reforestation has come to be one of the most effective, nature-driven methods to combat environmental degradation and enhance climate resilience. Beyond absorbing carbon dioxide, forests support livelihoods, stabilise ecosystems, and foster sustainable communities forests have a great role in countering global warming and providing essential resources that not only support communities but also manu-

facturing and trade. However, as research indicates, India in the past two decades has lost nearly 414kilo hectares of humid primary forest which made up 18 per cent of its total tree loss. This highlights an urgent need to prioritise reforestation, not

just as a climate action tool but also as a cornerstone for community development.

Reforestation's Dual Role: Action and Community Resilience Forests have an immense capacity to capture and store carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, thus reducing the greenhouse effect.

Panel on Climate Change, established in 1988 estimates reforestation and afforestation could account for up to 30 per cent of the carbon reduction required to limit global warming. Additionally, forests regulate microclimates, mitigating the urban heat island effect and stabilising local weather patterns crucial for agriculture. Reforestation plays a crucial role in combating desertification, which poses a significant threat to food security, water availability and livelihoods. Forests help anchor the soil, replenish organic matter, and improve water retention, thereby enhancing agricultural productivity and water access, particularly in ecologically fragile regions. According to

The UN's Intergovernmental

the India State of Forest Report 2021 (ISFR), tribal and rural communities living in these areas face high vulnerability but also exhibit remarkable climate resilience.

For these communities, reforestation is a game-changer as it can help prevent and even undo desertification by stabilising the soil using tree roots, which reduces wind and water erosion. Furthermore, forests help replenish organic material in the soil, leading to improved water retention and increased fertility which can lead to environmental regeneration and socio-economic

Community-driven Reforestation: A Proven Model Even with rapid urbanisation, India's conservation ethos has a rich legacy of pro-



tecting nature. Be it the collective Chipko movement of the 1970s or the inspirational restoration of more than 1300 acres of Brahmaputra's Forest by Jadav Payeng, the Forest Man of India, the success of any reforestation effort hinges on community and local par-

With the input of individuals and stakeholders from communities, any conservation project remains culturally relevant, ecologically sound and Future To scale reforestation

Trump signs order paving way for transgender troop ban

President Donald Trump signed an executive order Monday directing Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth to revise the Pentagon's policy on transgender troops, likely setting in motion a future ban on their military service.

He also ordered troops to be reinstated who had left voluntarily or been booted for refusing COVID-19 vaccines, outlined new rollbacks in diversity programmes and provided for the deployment of a space-based missile defence shield for the US all on Hegseth's first day. Trump and Hegseth had described parts of the anticipated orders throughout the day, but the exact language did not drop until late Monday. A transgender ban had been widely expected, and Trump's order largely sets the stage for a future ban — but directs Hegseth to come up with how that

policy. In his order, Trump claimed that service by troops who identify as a gender other than their biological one "conflicts with a sol dier's commitment to an honourable, truthful, and disciplined lifestyle, even in one's personal life" and is harmful to military readiness, requiring a revised pol-

icy to address the matter. Trump had tried to ban transgender troops during his first term, but it was tangled up in the courts for years before being overturned by then-President Joe Biden shortly after he took office.Two groups, Lambda Legal and Human Rights Campaign, which represented transgender troops the first time, vowed to fight again."We have been here before and seven years ago were able to successfully block the earlier administration's effort," Lambda Legal attorney Sasha Buchert said. "Not only is such a move

During his first presidency, Trump established US Space Command and the US Space Force, which just marked its fifth birthday. Space continues to be a priority for the president, who has now directed the Pentagon to begin to develop the capability to shoot down missiles from space.

Tariff threat sways Colombia, but risks rise with Canada, Mexico

Having already forced Colombia to accept deportees by threatening a 25 per cent tariff, President Donald Trump is readying the same move against Canada and Mexico as soon as Saturday. But this time, the stakes are higher and many economists surveying the possible damage doubt Trump would be comfortable with what they say would be self-inflicted wounds from the tariffs.

'The potential for such sizable economic impacts ought to act as enough of a deter-rent that Trump will not end up imple-menting these higher tariffs," said Matthew Martin, senior US economist at the consultancy Oxford Economics.

Trump has repeatedly insisted that tariffs are coming on Canada and Mexico, despite both countries seeking to address his stated concerns about illegal border crossings and the smuggling of fentanyl. But the Republican president is also motivated by the idea that tariffs would force other countries to "respect" the United

"We're going to immediately install massive tariffs," Trump said in a Monday speech, adding, "Colombia is traditionally a very, very strong-willed country," but it backed down rather than face import taxes. Multiple economic analyses show

that universal tariffs against Canada and Mexico risk more nflation and an economic slowdown. It's a much larger play than Trump's moves against Colombia, which accounts for roughly 0.5 per cent of US

By contrast, nearly 30 per cent of all US imports hail from Canada and Mexico, amplifying the risk that tariffs could fuel inflation and undermine Trump's campaign promises to get prices under control. Trump's director of the White House National Economic Council, Kevin Hassett, dismissed these concerns. He said the sceptical analyses of tariffs don't look at the totality of Trump's promises.

When the people who are trying to cause panic over President Trump's trade policy simulate what it's going to do, they don't account for all the other policies," Hassett said in a Monday interview on the Fox Business Network. "So President Trump is drill, baby, drill, and deregulate and tax cuts and reduce spending."
After Trump's initial threat of 25 per cent

tariffs in November, Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum suggested Mexico could retaliate with tariffs of its own. Since then, she has been more measured, choosing to emphasize the strong bilateral relationship and willingness to engage in dialogue as the number of detentions at the US-Mexico border has plunged.

Sheinbaum pointed out in November that drugs were a US problem, but in December the Mexican military seized more than a ton of fentanyl pills in two raids, calling it the biggest catch of synthetic opioids in Mexico's history.

On Monday, Sheinbaum applauded the agreement reached by the Trump administration and Colombia. "I believe the important thing, as I said on the first day, is to always act with a cool head, defend ing each country's sovereignty and the respect among nations and peoples," she

Top Canadian ministers said last week that Canada was prepared to retaliate if Trump imposed import taxes, even as Canadian Foreign Minister Mélanie Joly said they "will continue to work on preventing tariffs". The working theory in Canada appears to involve being ready for anything that the US president might do.

On Monday, the economics division of the insurance company Nationwide estimated that Trump's proposed tariffs on Canada and Mexico would increase inflation by as much as 0.5 percentage points and pull down growth by 0.7 percentage points. The analysis noted it did not 'account for potential retaliatory tariffs from Canada or Mexico, which could amplify the deleterious impact on inflation and GDP growth".

Serbia's PM resigns as anti-corruption protests grow

Serbia's populist Prime Minister Milos Vucevic resigned Tuesday in an attempt to calm political tensions and pressure roiled by weeks of massive anti-corruption protests over the deadly collapse of a concrete canopy.

The canopy collapse in November, which killed 15 people in the northern city of Novi Sad, has become a flashpoint reflecting wider discontent with the increasingly autocratic rule of Serbia's populist President Aleksandar Vucic. He has faced accusations of curbing democratic freedoms in Serbia despite formally seeking European Union membership for the troubled Balkan nation.

"It is my appeal for everyone to calm down the passions and return to dialogue," Vucevic told a news conference announcing his resignation. Novi Sad Mayor Milan Djuric also stepped down on Tuesday. Vucevic's resignation could lead to an early parliamentary

election. The resignation must

be confirmed by Serbia's parlia-

ment, which has 30 days to

choose a new government or

Pro-government media said President Vucic will attend a Cabinet session on Tuesday evening to decide whether a new prime minister-designate will be appointed or an early election called.

Opposition parties have said they would insist on a transitional government that would create conditions for a free and fair election. Vucic's populists have faced accusations of irregularities during past elections. Vucevic became the prime minister in April 2024, after the Serbian Progressive Party won most votes in an election

They (ruling party) have been in a free fall since the Novi Sad tragedy," journalist Slobodan Georgiev said on N1 television. adding that Vucic was seeking a "buffer" with the prime minister's resignation.

Vucic in the past had managed to cushion the impact of antigovernment street protests, but the current student movement has garnered widespread sup-port from all walks of life, including actors, farmers, lawyers and judges. The students' call for justice has

resonated in a country where corruption is widespread and few feel that the state institutions work in the interests of citizens.

Branimir Jovancicevic, professor at the Faculty of Chemistry in Belgrade, expressed hope that Vucevic's resignation is a first step toward further political changes in Serbia, where power is concentrated in the nands of the president although his constitutional role is largely ceremonial.

'If the president thinks that by replacing one, essentially, unimportant figure ... will solve the problem ... he is deeply mis-taken," said Jovancicevic. "This

changes because autocracy and dictatorship in Serbia, in the heart of Europe, must be stopped?

On Monday, tens of thousands of people joined striking university students in a 24-hour blockade of a key traffic intersection in the Serbian capital. Serbia's students are demanding accountability for the canopy collapse that critics have blamed on rampant government corruption. Classes at Serbia's universities

and dozens of schools have been blocked for two months with students camping inside their faculty buildings.

In another attempt to defuse tensions, Vucic, Vucevic and Parliament Speaker Ana Brnabic on Monday evening urged dialogue with the students, who have so far rebuffed such invitations. They say Vucic shouldn't be the one holding talks with them but that government institutions such as police and the judiciary should do their job.

Vucevic said the immediate cause for his quitting was an attack on a female student in Novi Sad early Tuesday by assailants allegedly from the

Party. Vucevic said that "whenever it seems there is hope to return to social dialogue, to talk... it's like an invisible hand creates a new incident and

tensions mount again." But the outgoing prime minister also said that the street protests "undoubtedly" have been organized from abroad 'with an aim to directly jeopardize Serbia as a state." Vucevic offered no evidence for his claims that echoed earlier similar statements by Vucic.

"I can never justify or understand many of these protests, blockades of lives, of roads and the freedom of movement of other citizens," he said.

Students in Novi Sad said they were horrified by the assault they said was carried out by thugs with baseball bats. They attacked two groups of students and chased them in their car. the students said. Prosecutors later said that four people have been detained.

We are horrified over the state of our society where such a situation is possible," the students said in an Instagram post. "We have had enough of

The students called a big rally

in Novi Sad later Tuesday in response to the attack. Serbia's prosecutors have filed

charges against 13 people, including a government minister and several state officials for the November canopy collapse. But the former Construction Minister Goran Vesic, who had resigned shortly after the canopy crash, has been released from detention, fuelling doubts over the investigation's independence.

The main railway station in Novi Sad was renovated and inaugurated twice in recent years as part of a wider infrastructure deal with Chinese state companies and a fast railway link with neighbouring Hungary.

Several incidents have marred the street demonstrations in the past weeks, including drivers ramming in to the crowds on two occasions, when two young women were injured. Students and others have been

nolding daily 15-minute traffic blockades throughout Serbia at 11:52 am, the exact same time the concrete canopy crashed down on Nov 1. The blockades honour the 15 victims, including two children. The blockades were also held on Tuesday.

Russian govt delegation makes first official visit to Syria since Assad's fall

Adelegation of Russian officials arrived in Damascus on Tuesday, Russian state news agency RIA Novosti reported.

It is the first such delegation to visit Syria since the fall of former President Bashar Assad, an ally of Moscow, in December in a lightning rebel offensive. Assad took refuge in Russia after his ouster.

The report said the delega-tion included Russian deputy foreign minister Mikhail Bogdanov and the Russian president's special envoy for Syria, Alexander Lavrentyev. RIA Novosti didn't offer any other details of the visit. There was no official com-

ment from Syria's interim government, but the semiofficial Al Watan newspaper reported that the Russian delegation would meet with the country's de facto leader, Ahmad al-Sharaa, and with the its foreign minister. Moscow's scorched-earth intervention in support of Assad once turned the tide of Svria's civil war. Syria's new authorities have

not cut off relations with Moscow or forced a complete exit of Russian military forces from bases in Syria but earlier this month, A Watan reported that a contract with a Russian company to manage the port in Tartous had been cancelled. Following Assad's downfall, Russia relocated its troops and assets from all over Syria to its main hub at the Hmeimim air base near Latakia.

There has been no indication that Moscow was preparing to evacuate the Hmeimim base or the naval facility in Tartus altogether. The termination of a contract for a Russian company to modernise the Tartus commercial port did not directly impact the Russian naval facility, which was leased under a separate deal.

Dozens of demonstrators attacked several foreign embassies, including those of Rwanda, France and Belgium, on Tuesday demanding that they oppose the advance of Rwandabacked M23 rebels into a major city in the country's conflict-battered east.

Police fired teargas at the protesters as they marched to the embassies in Kinshasa, looting and setting fires to parts of the buildings. The embassies of Kenya and Uganda were also attacked, according to Associated Press journalists at the scene. Congo's security forces were attempting to slow the rebels, who advanced into Goma, a key eastern city, in a major escalation of the decadeslong conflict. The M23 rebels are one of about 100 armed groups vying for a foothold in the mineral-rich region in the conflict, one of Africa's

The protesters demanded that the international community pressure Rwanda over the rebel advance.

'We denounce the hypocrisy of the international commusaid Timothée Tshishimbi, one of the protesters. "They must tell Rwanda to stop this adventure." Residents reported gunfire overnight in Goma, a city of 2 million people which the rebels claimed to have captured on Monday. Explosions and gunfire were heard near the now-shut Goma airport. Goma is a regional trade and humanitarian hub holding hundreds of thousands of the more than 6 million people displaced by eastern Congo's prolonged conflict over ethnic tensions that have resulted in one of the world's largest humanitarian crises. The M23 rebels temporarily took over Goma in 2012 before being forced to pull out under international pres-

sure, and resurfaced in late 2021 with increasing support from Rwanda, according to Congo's government and United Nations experts. Rwanda has denied such support. It was unclear how much of Goma is controlled by the rebels, who marched into the city early Monday to both fear and cheers among residents. It was the culmination of weeks of fighting during which the rebels captured several towns in a shocking advance.

"Since morning we have heard bomb explosions and crackling bullets," said Sam Luwawa, a resident of Goma. "So far we cannot say who really controls the city."

Three South African peacekeepers were killed on Monday when the rebels launched a mortar bomb toward the Goma airport which landed on the nearby South African National Defense Force, while a fourth soldier succumbed to injuries

sustained in fighting days ago, the South African Department of Defence said Tuesday. That makes 17 peacekeepers and foreign soldiers who have been killed in the fighting, according to UN and army officials. The humanitarian situation in Goma "is extremely, extremely worrying, with a new threshold of violence and suffering reached today," Bruno Lemarquis, the United Nations humanitarian coordinator for Congo, told reporters in a video news conference on Monday. He said hundreds of thousands of people were attempting to flee the violence. There were active combat zones in all areas of the city, with civilians taking cover and heavy artillery fire directed at the city centre on Monday, Lemarquis said. He said several shells struck the Charité Maternelle Hospital in central Goma, "killing and injuring civilians, including newborns

and pregnant women"."What is unfolding in Goma is coming on top of what is already one of the most protracted, complex, serious humanitarian crises on Earth, with close to 6.5 million displaced people in the country, including close to 3 million displaced people in North Kivu," Lemarquis said.Aid groups are reporting they are unable to reach displaced people who rely on them for food and other necessities. "Key roads surrounding Goma are blocked, and the city's airport can no longer be used for evacuation and humanitarian efforts. Power and water have reportedly been cut to many areas of the city," said David Munkley, head of operations in eastern Congo for the Christian aid group World Vision.In addition to the UN, several countries including the United States, United Kingdom and France have condemned Rwanda for the rebel advance.

1975 was International Women's year; 50 years on, the fight continues

In December 1972, the same month the Whitlam government was first elected, the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 1975 as International Women's Year (IWY). This set in train a series of world-changing events, in which Australia was

to play a significant part. The aim of IWY was to end discrimination against women and enable them to participate fully in economic, social and political life. Fifty years later, such participation has become an indicator of development and good governance. But the full promise of International Women's year has yet to be fulfilled, hampered by pushback and the scourge of genderbased violence. 'The greatest consciousness-

raising event in history' Dubbed "the greatest consciousness-raising event in history", the UN's first World Conference on Women took place in Mexico City in June 1975. Consciousness-raising had been part of the repertoire of women's liberation. Now it was taken up by government and intergovernmental bodies. The Mexico City conference was agenda-setting in many ways. The Australian government delegation, led by Elizabeth Reid, helped introduce the world of multilateral diplomacy to the language of the women's movement. As Reid said: "We argued that,

whenever the words "racism",

"colonialism" and "neo-colonialism" occurred in documents of the conference, so too should "sexism", a term that had not to that date appeared in United Nations documents or debates

Reid held the position of women's adviser to the prime minister. In this pioneering role, she had been able to obtain government commitment and funding for Australia's own national consciousness-raising exercise during IWY. A wide range of small grants promoted attitudinal change – "the revolution in our heads" – whether in traditional women's organisations, churches and unions, or through providing help such as Gestetner machines to the new women's centres.

grants explicitly did not in our language and our behavinclude the new women's services, including refuges, women's health centres and rape crisis centres. Their funding was now regarded as an ongoing responsibility for government, rather than suitable for one-off grants.

IWY began in Australia with a televised conversation on New Year's Day between Reid and Governor-General John Kerr on hopes and aspirations for the year. On International Women's Day (March 8), Prime Minister Gough Whitlam's speech emphasised the need for attitudinal change: Both men and women must be made aware of our habitual patterns of prejudice which we often do not see as such but whose existence manifests itself

The Australian postal service celebrated the day by releasing a stamp featuring the IWY symbol, showing the spirit of women breaking free of their traditional bonds. At Reid's suggestion, IWY materials, including the symbol, were printed in the purple, green and white first adopted by Emmeline Pankhurst in 1908 and now known as the suffragette colours.

Inside government, Reid had introduced the idea that all Cabinet submissions needed to be analysed for gender impact. After the Mexico City conference, this idea became part of new international norms of governance.

Following the adoption at the action provided further impe-

conference of the World Plan of Action, the idea that governments needed specialised policy machinery to promote gender equality was disseminated

around the world. Given the amount of ground to be covered, IWY was expanded to a UN Decade for Women (1976-85). By the end of it, 127 countries had established some form of government machinery to advance the status of women. Each of the successive UN world conferences (Copenhagen 1980, Nairobi 1985, Beijing 1995) generated new plans of action and strengthened systems of reporting by governments. The Fourth World Conference

Despite being sidelined since October 2023 due to an ACL injury, former Barcelona and Paris Saint-Germain star Neymar was part of the squad that won last season's Saudi league.

Their deal was due to expire after Al-Hilal's participation in this year's FIFA Club World Cup, which will be played between June 15 and July 13 in the United

The club said in a statement published on its social media channels on Monday that it "expresses its thanks and appreciation to Neymar for what he has provided throughout his career with Al-Hilal."

The striker joined the Saudi club

August 2023 for 90 million euros (USD 94 million), in one of many transactions that placed the Arab country as one of the new big soccer markets in the world. But Neymar picked up his ACL injury, the most serious of his career, playing for Brazil only months after he joined Al-Hilal.

Neymar returned in October and had his most recent appearance for the Saudi club in November. The Brazilian said in different interviews there were doubts on whether coach Jorge Jesus would count on him for the rest of the

The 21-year-old Urbig is considered one of Germany's best young goalkeepers, and his move to Bayern suggests the club believes he could one day replace Manuel Neuer, who is still No. 1 but heading toward the end of his career

'We're delighted that we've been able to complete another transfer with a view to the future," Bayern sport director Christoph Freund said, referring to Bayern also signing German youth international Tom Bischof last week.

Freund said Urbig is "very ambitious and has huge potential," calling him "a modern goalkeeper who fits in very well with Bayern's style of play in terms of the forward and the opposition

goalkeeping." That suggests Urbig will be expected to follow Neuer's example of aggressive goalkeeping, emerging from his goal quickly to snuff out danger with clearances, limiting the occasions he'll be called upon to make a save. Neuer, who can be far from his goal with his team in possession, is sometimes caught out, but more often he gives the team security going little time to recover from pressure.

Kicker magazine reported Bayern was paying up to 10 million euro bonuses to Cologne for Urbig. He is expected to compete with the 36-year-old Sven Ulreich and injured Israeli goalkeeper Daniel Peretz for the No. 2 position behind Neuer.

Neuer, who will be 39 in March, has faced scrutiny already this season after he was sent off for the first time in a German Cup loss to Bayer Leverkusen.

year-old Alexander Nübel is another potential successor for Neuer. Urbig's signing means Stuttgart coach Sebastian Hoeness can likely count on Nübel in goal again next season, too. Nübel extended his Bayern contract last year to 2029.

Urbig, who will compete with Freiburg's Noah Atubolu to be Germany goalkeeper at the Under-21 European Championship in June, started this season in the second division for Cologne, but lost his place to Marvin Schwäbe after the first 10 league games of the season. Bayern gave Urbig a contract

India pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah on Tuesday won the prestigious Sir Garfield Sobers Award for ICC men's Cricketer of the Year after delivering "a master-class in skill, precision, and relentless consistency" across formats in a record-shattering 2024.

The 31-year-old was adjudged the ICC's Test Cricketer of the Year on

ICC's Test Cricketer of the Year on Monday and was also named in the Test Team of the Year last week.

"Jasprit Bumrah has been honoured with the prestigious Sir Garfield Sobers Award for ICC Men's Cricketer of the Year at the ICC Awards, recognising his extraordinary 2024, in which he dominated opponents in the longest as well as the shortest format of the game," the ICC said.
Bumrah played a key role across

formats for India as he became the fifth winner of the award from the country after Rahul Dravid (2004), Tendulkar Ravichandran Ashwin (2016) and Virat Kohli (2017, 2018).

"The pacer's brilliance was reflected in his ICC Test Bowling Rankings, where he crossed the elusive 900-point mark, ending the year with a record-breaking 907 points — the highest for



any Indian bowler in history," the governing body stated in its tribute. "Across formats, Bumrah's 2024 exploits were a masterclass in skill, precision, and relentless consistency,

as he shattered record after record and

India with 15 wickets in their titlecemented his place as the world's premier fast bowler," it added.

Bumrah had a stellar year 2024 in which he played a decisive role for Winning campaign in the T20 World Cup in the Americas and also became the fastest Indian pacer to reach 200 Test wickets with a bowling average of

"I'm very happy with the honour, but I don't let myself get too high. My feet are on the ground and I'm really happy with the accolades that I get," the amiable bowler from Gujarat said in a

video statement. At the T20 World Cup, his 15 wickets came at an astonishing average of 8.26 and an economy of just 4.17, making

him the Player of the Tournament. He also garnered 900 points in ICC Test bowling rankings and ended the year with 907 points, which is the highest for any Indian bowler in

In Tests, Bumrah finished the year with 71 wickets in only 13 matches at an average of 14.92, which was also the second best among fast bowlers to former India centain Kapil Day's 100 former India captain Kapil Dev's 100 wickets in 1983.

The right-arm pacer was at the peak of his performance in the Border-Gavaskar Trophy Down Under towards the end of 2024, snaffling 32 wickets in five Tests.

Overall, Bumrah claimed 77 wickets in the World Test Championship points table for India but the two-time finalists failed to make a third appearance in the summit clash for
