# CM orders probe into Tirupati stampede

■ 2 officials suspended, 3 shifted; ■ ₹25L ex gratia for deceased

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Thursday ordered a judicial inquiry into the tragic stampede incident in Tirupati that resulted in six deaths and left nearly 40 devotees injured. He also announced the suspension of several senior officials for their role in the incident, including Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Raman Kumar, and SV Gosala Director Dr. Harinath Reddy, who were directly responsible for the site's management. Additionally, three other officials — JEO Goutami, SP Subbarayudu, and CVSO Sridhar — have been transferred as part of the administrative overhaul.

Addressing a media conference in Tirupati on Thursday, Naidu expressed his deep sorrow over the incident and assured that steps would be taken to prevent such occurrences in the future. He pledged to ensure a smoother and safer Vaikuntha Dwara Darshanam for devotees, especially during the Vaikuntha Ekadasi celebrations.

The Chief Minister also announced ex gratia compensation for the victims: Rs 25 lakh to the families of the deceased, Rs 5 lakh to those severely injured, and Rs 2 lakh for the 33 others who are receiving medical treatment. Naidu assured that arrangements would be made for the injured devotees to receive a special darshan of Lord Venkateswara on January 10, following their wishes.

Naidu explained that the stampede occurred as devotees were queuing up for Vaikuntha Dwara Darshanam tokens. He noted that the new system of issuing tokens in Tirupati, introduced by the previous government, might have contributed to the confusion. He emphasised that the system would be reviewed in consultation with Agama experts to make it more pilgrim-friendly and aligned with temple traditions.

A mild scuffle broke out at SvIMS hospital on Thursday evening when two prominent political figures, Pawan Kalyan and Y.S. The high-profile visits, combined with the tense atmosphere due to the critically ill victims, led to confusion and disorder, highlighting major lapses in security arrangements at the hospital.

However, the visit seemed to take the hospital staff by surprise, as there had been no prior coordination to ensure proper security and crowd control.

State govt seeks relief of Rs 151.77 cr for farmers

In a meeting held at the State Disaster Management Office on Thursday, Sisodia explained the challenges faced by the state due to the drought. The state government has officially declared 54 mandals in five districts as drought-affected.

# Tirupati stampede sparks national outrage over crowd management

#### 37 students hit by diarrhoea, 13 hospitalised

Fearing a clash between their supporters, hospital staff struggled to maintain order. The scuffle grew intense, and security personnel had to intervene. However, the lack of preparation made it difficult to restore calm quickly. Medical staff were also caught in the chaos, with some patients and their families expressing frustration over the disruption. This incident not only

exposed the lack of proper security measures but also raised concerns about how sensitive situations should be handled. With the stampede victims already in critical condition, the added stress of the political visit further exacerbated the tense atmosphere. Many critics of the administration pointed out that the hospital should have been better prepared for the simultaneous visits of both political figures, particularly in such a highly charged environment.

#### Vijayawada Division seeks reduction in electrical traction tariff rates

Increased tariffs to elevate operational costs for the Railways

The Vijayawada Division of the South Central Railway (SCR) has submitted a formal plea to the Andhra Pradesh Electricity Regulatory Commission (APERC) to reconsider the proposed electricity tariff rates for railway traction for the financial year 2025-26. This submission was made during a public consultation meeting held by APERC in Vijayawada as part of its State-wide review of electricity tar-

Representing the South Central Railway, Ch Dinesh Reddy, Senior Divisional Electrical Engineer, Traction Distribution, presented the case for a reduction in the pronie case for a reduction in the proposed retail supply tariff rates. Highlighting the impact of the announced rates by APDISCOMs on December 7, 2024, Dinesh Reddy pointed out that the increased tariffs will significant-Indian Railways. This development could hamper the progress of electrification projects and critical infrastructure upgrades, such as tripling and quadrupling of railway lines, in Andhra

The Indian Railways, which plays a pivotal role in affordable public and goods transportation, is committed to achieving 100 per cent electrification in alignment with the Government of India's green energy initiatives. However, the high proposed tariff rates threaten the feasibility of these initiatives, posing a challenge to the Railways' efforts to enhance operational efficiency and sustainability, he said.

In its plea, SCR underscored the need for Andhra Pradesh to align its tariff policies with neighbouring States. Comparative data presented by the Railways revealed that Andhra Pradesh's current per-unit rate of Rs 7.89 is signifcantly higher than Telangana's Rs 7.13 and the rates in states like Karnataka, Maharashtra, and Rajasthan, which range between Rs 6.10 and Rs 6.60 through open access arrangements. The Railways also proposed the introduction of a monthly rebate, similar to the one per cent rebate offered in Odisha, to acknowledge its status as a bulk consumer with a consistent payment record.

A Patil, Divisional Railway Manager, Vijayawada Division, stated, "Vijayawada Division remains committed to delivering efficient and affordable services to our passengers. However, the proposed tariff rates pose a significant challenge to our cost-efficiency initiatives. We urge APERC to consider our plea and work towards a mutually beneficial solution that supports both Indian Railways and the energy sector."



## VMRDA plans to construct roads using plastic waste

Initiative aims to tackle plastic pollution and enhance road durability

The Visakhapatnam Metropolitan Region Development Authority (VMRDA) has unveiled an ambitious plan to construct roads using plastic waste, aligning with the Central government's mission to promote sustainable infrastructure d combat plastic pollution

Speaking to The Pioneer, VMRDA Commissioner KS Viswanathan shared details of the initiative, noting that the Centre issued directives on November 26, 2024 mandating the use of plastic waste in road construction within a 50-kilometre radius of urban centres with populations exceeding five lakhs. These orders focus on integrating plastic waste into specific applications, such as wearing coats for service and slip roads on national highways.

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has accelerated the rollout by directing the construction of 15 link roads connecting to the national highway, prioritising their completion ahead of the Bhogapuram International Airport's inauguration. The project will involve collaboration among VMRDA, the Roads and Buildi Panchayat Raj, and the Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal

Corporation (GVMC). Commissioner Viswanathan explained that non-recyclable plastic waste will make up to eight percent of the total road construction materials. "Road construction contracts will only be awarded to contractors who agree to incorporate plastic waste in their projects," he emphasised.

This approach not only address-

es the city's growing plastic waste management challenges, but also offers significant cost reductions and improved road durability. "Plastic-mixed roads prevent water penetration, reduce deterioration during rains, and provide a sustainable solution for managing waste," the Commissioner added.

The Ministry of Road Tr and Highways has established guidelines for using plastic waste in infrastructure Viswanathan hailed the initiative as a transformative step. "This is a win-win solution that combines innovation, sustainability, and economic efficiency.

## 11 arrested in ₹5 crore fake loan scam

#### YSRCP slams govt for negligence over Tirupati stampede

The YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) has expressed deep anguish over the tragic stampede in Tirupati and held the coalition government responsible for the loss of lives, accusing it of negligence and political interference that compromised the sanctity of the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD).

At separate press conferences, former Minister RK Roja, MLA Busineni Virupakshi, YSRCP Guntur district president Ambati Rambabu, and former LIDCAP chairman Kakumanu Rajashekar criticised the ruling coalition government, TTD officials, and other key individuals for administrative

lapses that led to the tragedy.
Former Minister RK Roja blamed the government for its failure to manage the massive influx of devotees despite prior knowledge of the expected crowd size. She called the incident a case of "criminal negligence" and demanded a transparent investigation under BNS-105, which addresses criminal liability. Roja also sought Rs.1 crore compensation for the families of the deceased and Rs.25 lakh for the injured, along with the resignation

of TTD Chairman B.R. Naidu and other responsible officials. Roja pointed out the lack of basic amenities such as food and water for devotees waiting in long queues and accused officials of prioritising political events over public safety.

Alur MLA Busineni Virupakshi expressed his anguish, accusing the TTD leadership of turning temple administration into a political platform. He demanded accountability from Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan, and TTD Chairman B.R. Naidu. "Who will take moral responsibility for these deaths?" he asked, demanding immediate resignations and corrective actions.

Virupakshi also criticised Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan for his silence on the issue and urged the coalition government to prioritise public welfare over political interests. Former Minister Ambati

Rambabu echoed these sentiments, holding the ruling coalition responsible for misgovernance and the politicisation of temple administration. He accused Chief Minister Naidu of appointing TTD Chairman BR Naidu based on political loyalty rather than merit.

# 'Genome India data will help develop precision medicines'

Genome sequencing data of 10,000 Indians will now be available to researchers to develop precision medicines tailored for the local popula-tion, a step hailed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a "milestone" in biotechnology research.

In a video-recorded statement to the Genomics Data Conclave here, Modi said the national database encapsulated the extraordinary genetic landscape of the country and promised to serve as an invaluable scientific resource.

The Genome India Data, that represents the genetic diversity in the country, will be available to researchers at the Indian Biological Data Centre (IBDC) through "managed access". "The GenomeIndia Project is an important milestone in the biotechnology revolution in India. I am told that through this project we have succeeded in creating a diverse genetic resource in the country," Modi said.

At the conclave organised by Department Biotechnology, Science and Technology Minister Jitendra Singh unveiled the 'Framework for Exchange of Data (FeED) Protocols' for sharing of genetic data with researchers

'Indian Biological Data Centre (IBDC) DATA Access Portal' and unveiled the 'Call for proposals on Genome India Data'. "This will help in understanding the unique genomic

patterns of the Indian population. And only then can we prepare special solutions or effective medicines for the specific problems of a particular group," the prime minis-

Modi said in India, researchers were still unaware of several illnesses that are transferred from one generation to the next and the GenomeIndia Project will help in the development of effective treatment for all such diseases.

The prime minister noted that the GenomeIndia Project was launched in 2020 and scientists from 20 research institutes worked through the Covid pandemic on the whole genome sequencing of 10,000

"It will facilitate advancements in the treatment of genetic and infectious diseases, foster the development of new medications and precision medical techniques, and enable research into the lifestyles and habits of diverse communities," Modi said.

The prime minister said the world was looking towards India for solutions to global problems. "This is both a responsibility and an opportunity for our coming generations. Therefore, today a very large research ecosystem is being created in India. In the last 10 years, a lot of emphasis has been given to research and innovation at every level of education, he said. Modi said India has established its identity as a major pharma hub of the world and has taken many revolutionary steps regarding public healthcare in the past decade.

Principal Scientific Adviser Prof. Ajay Kumar Sood, Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) Director General and Secretary, Department of Health Research Rajiv Bahl, and Secretary in Department of Biotechnology Rajesh S Gokhale were present on the occasion.

#### Kejriwal accuses BJP of manipulating electoral roll

FILES COMPLAINT WITH EC

PNS NEW DELHI

AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday lodged a complaint with the Election Commission, alleging that the BJP has manipulated the electoral roll in the New Delhi assembly constituency from where he is contesting the upcoming elections.

"This raises serious concerns, as when the Election Commission contacted some of these people, they denied submitting such applications. All 89 individuals contacted stated they had not filed any requests. It clear-

ly indicates a scam," he said. Kejriwal further highlighted the sudden surge in voter registration applications. "In the last 15 days, applications for adding 13,000 new voters have been received.

Stating that Ayurveda is widely acknowledged as an earlier school of medicine, she said that the art of navigation was born in the Sindhu river about 6,000 years ago.



'Algebra, trigonometry and calculus were also first developed in India," she said.

This apart, Kangaloo also noted that India was the first

country of civilization which used the symbol zero (0) in arithmetic operations. The game of chess is also believed to have originated in eastern

India while the decimal system is widely acknowledged to have been developed in India.

'And India's very own Shushruta is widely acknowl-

edged to be the father of surgery," she said. ## **Breaking ice**

The India-Afghanistan talks reflect India's shift from nonrecognition of the Taliban to a pragmatic approach to engagement

n a significant step towards recalibrating ties, India and the Taliban-led Afghan government held a high-level meeting in Dubai. The dialogue, attended by India's Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri and Afghanistan's Acting Foreign Minister Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi, revolved around enhancing bilateral relations and addressing regional challenges. The talks, focusing on economic, humanitarian, and strategic cooperation, underscore India's pragmatic approach toward engaging with Afghanistan despite the complex political dynamics following the Taliban's return to power in 2021. India's relations with Afghanistan have been historically robust, characterised by cultural and economic collaboration. However, the Taliban's return disrupted bilateral ties, with India maintaining a cautious stance while continuing to provide humanitarian aid. The evolving geopolitical landscape, Pakistan's actions in the region, and Afghanistan's dire humanitarian crisis have necessitated a renewed engagement. The discussions also



gain relevance amidst regional tensions, notably Pakistan's airstrikes in Afghanistan, which New Delhi strongly condemned. This shared concern over Islamabad's destabilising actions further aligns Indian and Afghan interests, fostering mutual coop-

The Dubai meeting covered a wide range of topics. India reaffirmed its commitment to aiding Afghanistan's recovery. It pledged continued support in healthcare, food security, and disaster relief, building on its earlier contributions, such as 50,000 metric tonnes of wheat, medical supplies, and vaccines. Besides, both sides emphasised the strategic impor-

tance of Chabahar Port in Iran as a key trade and humanitarian supply route. The port offers Afghanistan access to global markets, bypassing Pakistan, and could serve as a stabilising economic lifeline for the war-torn country. India has expressed readiness to resume developmental activities, including infrastructure and capacity-building projects. This signals India's willingness to strengthen Afghanistan's socio-economic framework despite challenges posed by the Taliban's governance. The Afghan delegation addressed India's concerns about terrorism and regional stability, assuring cooperation to prevent Afghanistan from becoming a safe haven for anti-India activities. The talks indicate a shift in India's approach. This may encourage other nations to adopt a similar stance, recognising the necessity of dealing with the Afghan government. But the biggest takeaway from this meeting indeed was Strengthening India-Afghanistan ties to counter Pakistan's influence in the region. Islamabad's strained relations with Kabul, exacerbated by recent airstrikes, present an opportunity for New Delhi to assert its role as a reliable partner. Reviving trade and development projects through Chabahar Port could bolster Afghanistan's economy and offer India strategic leverage in Central



Navigating Trump redux: India's tightrope



While Trump's focus on countering China could strengthen Indo-US strategic ties, his erratic temperament and divisive policies present challenges

n India, there is a mix of excitement, tentativeness, and even concern, with the second coming of Donald Trump as the President of the United States. While Trump's excitable temperament is well known, he ought to be served better with hindsight of experience. But he may not. While India will remain resolutely relevant and critical in his foreign policy calculus, the handling of certain issues could test Indian reaction and patience. His inevitable fixation with managing China will necessitate nurturing the strategic 'pivot' of India as a counterbalance, Delhi's deep-rooted equations with countries like Russia or Iran, could earn his ire and vitriol

A lot will depend on 'Team Trump' who will aid and assist Trump as he attempts the shape his poll promises of MAGA i.e., Make America Great Again! However, unlike the first term when he did inherit and heed reputation and professionalism as the criteria for key jobs in the Trump administration (though subsequently, he developed a penchant for 'revolving door' ousters of many), this time the criteria only seem to be 'loyalty' to Trump, personally.

There is a disconcerting and contradictory logic to many recent appointments that begs the question if it indeed will be 'busiess as usual' – something Delhi had got used to, irrespective of the dispensation in Washington DC. Sadly, that vital presence of 'adults in the room' from the first Trump administration who were able to navigate and manage Trump out of his outlandish and fickle ideas, will not be present anymore. If anything, in a room filled with 'loyalists' (read, obsequious staff), chances that someone will play the 'adult in the room' anymore, will be starkly lesser than before, as there could be competitive grovelling to valourise Trump's ideas, whatever be the portent.How will Trump's purerences sit with Sino-wary countries like India, Japan or Australia (the other three from QUAD framework) that are in the direct line of Chinese belligerence and expansionism? Will Trump's 'non-intervention-

ist' instinct embolden Beijing to finally bite the bullet on Taiwan and storm the same, knowing that beyond mouthing platitudes, Washington DC will not intervene militarily? The picture emerging out of a beleaguered (and potentially isolated) Ukraine does not seem reassuring from a security angle, as the possibility of America pushing its 'allies' under the bus, seems very plausible. Even disconcerting memories of the Summer of 2020 when the Chinese aggression pushed through Indian frontiers, with a seemingly disinterested Trump offering to 'negotiate a deal' instead of adopting a more assertive stance, are still

inet are trigger-happy interventionists (e.g., Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Elise Stefanik the Ambassador to UN etc.,) a la neoconservatives whom Trump rubbish repeatedly – how this contradiction will manifest will be interesting. Even on non-security issues like immigration, trade terms, or commitment towards the environmental issues, could be a very rocky ride for Delhi. India has made ambitious commitments towards the global environmental cause,

whereas Trump's rhetoric has cockily been, "We're going to drill, baby, drill," and confirmed that, "I will terminate the green new scam". While India isn't on top of its target list on immigrant issues, it will only be a matter of time before the bogey "stealing your jobs" a mega populist who will dance to the 'redneck' wish list and this will impact relations with the world's largest democracy, a lot more gravely than other countries.

Trump has demonstrated a ter-

rifying ability to shed responsibilities towards his allies (sovereign, coalition, and even personal) and also his moral responsibility by readily abandoning its vital geostrategic stakes (remember Afghanistan, and now Syria) with a thoughtless shrug of the

shoulder and "not my problem" approach. This tests the will to invest in a transactional relationship like the one offered by Trump, as no support can be construed for

Owing to his polarising politics of identity and blind support for the likes of Benjamin Netanyahu, the narrative emanating from the White House could jeopardise and harm the societal fabric of a diverse country like India that needs to maintain an inclusive outlook. America itself is in for a tumultuous time with the President-designate having promised to close the border with Mexico and launch the largest deportation exercise in US history within hours (not days) of taking over. While Donald Trump's rhetoric is usually more bark than bite, India may find it difficult to accommodate his provocative talk and temperament, beyond a point.

#### **INDIA'S GDP GAP WITH CHINA WIDENS**

Madam — An analysis of the economies done by a start-up highlights the pressing necessity to boost India's lacklustre growth. In 1980, India's Gross Domestic Product was \$186 billion, close to China's \$303 billion. But, by 2024, India's GDP had grown 21 times to \$3.93 trillion, while China's GDP had surged to \$18.5 trillion-61 times its 1980 level. To put it differently, China's GDP in 2004 was 2.82 times greater than India's. In 2014, it was 5.13 times greater and in 2024, 4.71 times greater. India's GDP surged 2.94 times from \$694 billion to \$2,043 billion between 2004 and 2014, while it grew merely 1.92 times, reaching \$3,930 billion between 2014 and 2024. Had the GDP growth in the decade starting in 2004 persisted in the decade beginning in 2014, the GDP disparity would have further

decreased. The decade before 2004 was a period of consolidation after structural reforms were initiated. India has to rejig its economic strategy to achieve a consistent 9-10 per cent rate of growth. India chose a mixed economic system, which combines the features of both socialist and freemarket economic systems. The recent push towards private investment in government-owned assets has served only as an easy route for crony capitalists to enrich themselves into billionaires. Democratic India can consider a new economic system aimed at fostering faster

However, growth in Southern India, which accounts for about 31 per cent of GDP, has thrived under the current system and can accelerate further with adequate support from the Centre. Northern India needs to explore strategies to bridge the gap with the South. And the ostrich-like attitude and constant denials hinder progress in addressing realities. The nation must embark on a rapid growth path that creates jobs, elevates the living standard of common man

and reduces inequality.

#### **TRUMP 2.0: CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR ASEAN**

With Trump's return, Southeast Asia finds itself bracing for another era of US ambiguity

■ith the return of Donald Trump to the US presidency, Southeast Asia braces for another era of unpredictability in American foreign policy. Southeast Asian nations, while expressing formal congratulations following Trump's victory, are now focusing on how his administration will impact their economies and strategic interests. As the region's governments gear up for a distinctly different governance style than the one under President Joe Biden, the potential for dramatic shifts in trade relations, diplomatic ties and regional stability is palpable. The ten members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN)—spanning from Indonesia to Myanmar—are acutely aware that Southeast Asia may not be at the top of the new administration's

Trump is a known figure for his transactional and often unpredictable style of diplomacy. ASEAN countries, while understanding the volatility that a Trump administration can bring, remain cautiously optimistic that his return might lead to a return to serious trade talks. Many regional leaders believe that Trump's preference for direct, bilateral negotiations could lead to more favourable deals for specific countries, particularly those that are not bound by multilateral negotiations, like those seen under Biden's tenure. Yet, for many in Southeast Asia, the most pressing concern remains the US-China relationship. Since Trump's first term, ASEAN nations have had to balance their relationships with both China and the US, seeking to maintain economic growth and regional security without angering either side. The dynamic has changed considerably in the



post-pandemic era, as China and ASEAN emerged as each other's largest trade partners. The direction of US-China relations will have profound consequences for Southeast Asia's economic stability and security. Under Trump, this relationship was tense, marked by the trade war and military posturing, and the nomination of hardline China critics, such as Marco Rubio for Secretary of State and Mike Waltz as National Security

Advisor, signals that the US will continue to confront China head-on in ways that could disrupt regional dynamics. While many ASEAN leaders are concerned about the economic impact of a hard-line US-China policy, there is also hope that Trump's presidency could bring muchneeded attention back to Southeast Asia's trade and strategic importance. This could be particularly appealing to resource-rich nations like Indonesia and the Philippines, which are in high demand for critical minerals used in electronics and green technologies. On the other hand, a significant worry for ASEAN countries is that they may become collateral damage in the US's efforts to reduce its trade deficit.

Despite these uncertainties, ASEAN's primary goal will remain stability and balance. ASEAN countries will push for steady relationships with both global powers, aiming to shield themselves from the worst effects of US-China tensions while seeking to expand their own economic and diplomatic space. To avoid being left behind, India is watching the space closely, as it is well aware that Trump will target Delhi soon.

Delhi is trying to rebuild bilateral relationships with several ASEAN groups of countries, even as it participates with full vigour on the multilateral platform. The chief guest for 2025 Republic Day would be the President of Indonesia, a key country in ASEAN. India's exports to the US could be hit due to Trump's overtures and it needs to find new markets for its products, while gently easing out domestic compliances and trade barriers. The region's future relationship with the US will depend not only on Trump's domestic agenda but also on how ASEAN and India navigate the delicate balance between American and Chinese influence in the years to come.

ecently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has praised the film The Sabarmati Report produced by Ekta Kapoor and her Balaji Motion Pictures.
Before this also PM has been praised films - The Kashmir Files and The Kerala Story. It took almost seventy years after the independence of India, for a few courageous filmmakers like Vivek Agnihori to make Buddha in a Traffic Jam, The Tashkent Files, The Kashmir Files, and Vaccine War; Sanjay Puran Singh make 72 Hoorain and Sudipto Sen to make The Kerala Story and Bastar: The Naxal Story both produced by Vipul Shah. 

# India aims to boost organic products exports: Goyal

PNS NEW DELHI

India has the potential to increase exports of organic products up to Rs 20,000 crore in the next three years, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Thursday.

He said this while releasing the eighth edition of National Programme for Organic Production (NPOP) with new regulations aimed at enhancing clarity and transparency in organic product standards as well as aligning with global standards.

"Currently, our organic product exports are at Rs 5,000-6,000 crore. In the next three years, we can easily achieve Rs 20,000 crore exports, about 3-3.5 times increase from the current level," Goyal said at an event organised in partnership with industry body Ficci.

He said the global demand for these products is about Rs 1 lakh crore, which can grow up to Rs 10 lakh crore in the coming years, a unique opportunity India should not miss.

India already has one of the largest numbers of farmers in the world undertaking organ-



He also asked startups to come out with solutions that help in growth of the sector.

The NPOP has undergone several revisions since its inception in May 2001. The eighth edition marks a significant update to the regulatory framework governing organic products in India, with the last revision occurring in 2014.

Key features of the eighth edition of NPOP include farmer-friendly regulations, streamlined certification, enhanced transparency and revamped traceability system.

The eighth edition aims to bolster India's organic export

sector, with an ambitious target of reaching USD 2 billion in organic food exports by

#### Govt to give Rs 35,000 cr LPG subsidy to IOC, BPCL, HPCL

PNS NEW DELHI

The government is likely to provide a subsidy of Rs 35,000 crore to state-owned Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL), and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) to make up for losses they incurred on selling the fuel this fiscal, sources said.

The three fuel retailers have

kept the price of domestic LPG unchanged at Rs 803 per 14.2-kg cylinder since March 2024 despite a rise in input raw material cost. This led to under-recoveries on LPG sales, and the resultant drastic

fall in their earnings in the April-September (first half of current 2024-25 fiscal year).

The total under-recovery on LPG sales for the industry in the current fiscal is estimated at about Rs 40,500 crore. Against this, the government is likely to provide Rs 35,000 crore in total spread over two financial years, two sources with knowledge of the matter said.

IOC, BPCL and HPCL are likely to get Rs 10,000 crore during the current 2024-25 fiscal

and the remaining Rs 25,000 crore in the next, they said, adding that provision of the subsidy is likely to be made in the Union Budget for 2025-26 that Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present on February 1.

Sources said there is an under-recovery (or loss) of about Rs 240 per 14.2-kg cylinder that the state-owned fuel retailers sell to domestic house-

holds at the current price of Rs 803.

Prices of domestic LPG are regulated by government to insulate domestic households from high market rates. Regulated prices are lower than the Saudi CP - the interna-

tional benchmark used to price domestic LPG. This is because domestic LPG production is not sufficient to meet the local demand and the fuel has to be

imported. This leads to under-recoveries and consequent losses to the fuel retailers.

Government from time to time compensates IOC, BPCL and HPCL for these losses. The three were previously paid Rs 22,000 crore compensation for 2021-22 and 2022-23 fiscal

Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty tumbled nearly 1 per cent on Thursday due to heavy selling in market heavyweights HDFC Bank, TCS and Reliance as investors turned nervous over earnings growth concerns amid unabated foreign capital outflows.

Besides, abysmally low Chinese inflation data, an indication of poor demand, and a sell-off in US bonds added to the pressure, traders said.

Sliding for the second straight day, the 30-share benchmark dropped 528.28 points or 0.68 per cent to sink below the 78,000 level at 77,620.21. During the day, it tanked 605.57 points or 0.77 per cent to 77,542.92.

The NSE Nifty slumped 162.45 points or 0.69 per cent to 23,526.50.

The Indian stock market mirrored the decline across its Asian peers, with cautious investor sentiment driven by a

sell-off in US bonds. The ÚS 10-year Treasury yield surged to its highest level since April 2024, signalling the expectation of fewer rate cuts by the

putes, the Budget had announced a review of the customs duty rates. Currently, there are more than a dozen customs duty rates and the government is looking at reducing the number of rate slabs.

The Budget for 2025-26 will be tabled in Parliament on February 1.



## Why cancer is a 'young person's disease'

ancer has long been perceived as a disease that primarily affects older individuals. However, recent trends are challenging this notion, with cancer rates in young adults—those in their 20s and 30s—rising significantly. While this shift is alarming, understanding the reasons behind it and the importance of early detection can empower young people to take proactive steps toward better health.

#### Changing face of cancer

Statistics reveal a concerning rise in cancer cases among younger populations. Moreover, young bodies tend to metabolise medications differently, making treatment more aggressive in some



cases. The psychological impact of navigating cancer during what should be the prime of life often requires additional mental health support, which can be overlooked in traditional treatment plans.

#### Early detection is crucial

The key to combating this alarming trend lies in early detection and prevention. Cancer caught at an earlier stage is often more treatable, with significantly higher survival rates. Unfortunately, young adults are less likely to undergo regular screenings or report persistent symptoms to a healthcare provider.

Here are some steps to improve awareness and early detection:

- 1. Know the warning signs: Be vigilant about unexplained weight loss, persistent fatigue, unusual lumps, changes in bowel or urinary habits, or prolonged pain.
- 2. Adopt healthy habits: Maintain a balanced diet, exercise regularly, and avoid smoking or excessive alcohol consumption.

3. Stay informed about family history: If certain cancers run in your family, discuss genetic testing and earlier screening options with your doctor.

4. Advocate for yourself: If you notice concerning symptoms, don't hesitate to seek medical advice, even if you feel too young to be at risk.

A crucial aspect of addressing this trend is raising awareness among younger generations. Campaigns that highlight the importance of regular health check-ups and early cancer detection can help dispel the myth that cancer is exclusively an older person's disease. Healthcare providers, too, play a pivotal role in this shift. By offering tailored screening recommendations and emphasising the importance of prevention, medical professionals can bridge the gap between awareness and action.

#### Message of hope

Despite the rise in cancer rates among young adults, advancements in oncology offer hope. Improved diagnostic tools, targeted therapies, and personalised treatment plans are making it possible for many young patients to achieve full recovery and lead healthy lives. For millennials and Gen Z, the key takeaway is clear: cancer is no longer an age-restricted disease. By embracing proacage-restrict disease. By Chinaching protective healthcare, recognizing potential risks and prioritising early intervention, young people can take charge of their health and reduce their cancer risk. Together, healthcare providers, young adults and communities can work toward a future where no one is caught off guard by a diagnosis they thought belonged to another age group.

In Bumrah's absence, the home team chased down 162 on the third day to win the series 3-1. The lead pacer was handed the captaincy in the final Test after the out-of-form Rohit Sharma "opted out" but a back spasm prevented Bumrah from bowling on the crucial third

Bumrah destroyed Australia in Perth with eight wickets, grabbed six wickets in the first innings at the Gabba, and nearly turned the Boxing Day Test on its head with his exploits on the fourth afternoon at MCG.

In the series decider at SCG, Bumrah sent back Usman Khawaja and Marnus Labuschagne early in Australia's first innings but could only bowl one over after lunch on the second day when the game was evenly poised.

The onus will now fall on newcomers Titas Sadhu and Saima Thakor to make their mark.

Sadhu, 20, who has three wickets in ODIs and 13 wickets in T20Is, will be expected to provide early breakthroughs, having impressed with her pace and swing in domestic and recent international cricket. Saima, 28, will also look to continue her good form after taking seven wickets in eight ODIs so far.

Vice-captain and off-spinner Deepti Sharma will be crucial, especially after her career-best bowling performance of 6 for 31 in the third ODI against the West Indies. Priya Mishra and Tanuja Kanwar will play key roles in supporting Deepti.
