Special Court designated under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) has directed the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) to register an against former chairperson of Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) Madhabi Puri Buch, SEBI whole-time members and two top officials of the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) for alleged stock market fraud, regulatory violations and corruption.

Apart from Mudhabi Buch whole-time and three members Ashwani Bhatia, Ananth Narayan G and Kamlesh Chandra Varshney, the two top BSE officials against whom the special PMLA court has ordered the registration of an FIR are: BSE's Chairman Pramod Agarwal and its CEO Sundararaman Ramamurthy. "The allegations disclose a cognizable offence,

necessitating an investigation. There is prima facie evidence of regulatory lapses and collusion, requiring a fair and impartial probe. The inaction by law enforcement and SEBI necessitates judicial intervention under Section 156(3) CrPC," Special Court Judge Shashikant Eknathrao

Bangar said in the order

passed on Saturday. The Special ACB court passed an order directing the ACB, Mumbai, to register an FIR based on an application filed by a media person Sapan Shrivastava, who had sought an investigations under section 156(3) of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) into the offences allegedly



involving large-scale financial fraud, regulatory violations and corruption.

The allegations pertain to the fraudulent listing of a company on the stock exchange with the active connivance of regulatory authorities, particularly the SEBI, without compliance under the SEBI Act, 1992 and regulations and thereunder.

The complainant claimed that the SEBI officials failed in their statutory duty, facilitated market manipulation, and enabled corporate fraud by allowing the listing of a company that did not meet the prescribed norms.

Among other things, the complainant had alleged that he and his family had invested in shares of Cals Refineries Ltd on December 13, 1994, which was listed at BSE India, and that he had suffered huge losses. He alleged that SEBI and BSE neglected the crimes of the firm, listed it against the law, and failed to protect the interests of investors

Shrivastava alleged that the SEBI officials had facilitated market manipulation and enabled corporate fraud by

committed by Buch and allowing the listing of the Mudhabi Buch and others, company. He said in his company. He said in his application that he had approached the court as the police and regulatory authorities had failed to take police

action on his complaint. Court Citing Supreme judgements in the past, the Special Court Judge noted: Considering the gravity of allegations, applicable laws and settled legal precedents, Court deems it appropriate to direct an investigation under Section 156(3) of CrPC."

The ACB has been directed to register an FIR under the relevant provisions of Indian Penal Code (IPC), Prevention of Corruption Act, SEBI Act, and other applicable laws.

As per the order, the Special Court will monitor the investigations. The court has asked the ACB to file a status report within 30 days.

Meanwhile, the SEBI in a statement released to the media on Sunday dismissed the complaint - based on which the special court had passed the order — as the one coming from a "frivolous and habitual litigant" and said that it would challenge the order passed by the special court. "Even though these officials

were not holding their respective positions at the relevant point of time, the court allowed the application without issuing any notice or granting any opportunity to SEBI to place the facts on record," the SEBI stated in its statement. 'The applicant is known to be

a frivolous and habitual litigant, with previous intigant, with previous applications being dismissed by the court, with imposition of costs in some cases. SEBI would be initiating appropriate legal steps to challenge this order and remains committed to ensuring due regulatory compliance in all matters," the statement added.

It may be recalled that then SEBI chief Mudhabi Buch had come under a cloud in August last year after the Hindenburg report alleged that she and her husband Dhaval Buch "had hidden stakes in the exact same obscure offshore Bermuda and Mauritius funds, found in the same complex nested structure, used by Vinod Adani". The Hindenburg Research

which had accused the Adani group of "brazen stock market manipulation" and "accounting fraud" - had tried to connect the SEBI's inaction against the Adani group for alleged "stock market manipulation" with the investments made by Mudhabi Buch and her husband in offshore funds. Hindenburg's report had alleged that as a whole-time member of SEBI, Buch was in communication managers of offshore funds, and wrote to India Infoline to redeem the units in the fund.



Chamoli avalanche rescue death toll rises to eight

Death toll rose to eight in the avalanche mishap after rescue teams found the body of the last missing person on Sunday. Earlier in the day, the teams pulled out bodies of three labourers from the camp site which was buried in snow after the avalanche on Friday last. Fifty four workers of the Border Roads

Organisation (BRO)were buried in snow after their camp in Chamoli, Uttrakhand was hit by an avalanche. Rescue teams were able to bring out 46 workers while bodies of four labourers were pulled out from the camp on Sunday. Army doctors said 46 workers, who were earlier rescued, have been brought to the military hospital in Jyotirmath, while one with a spinal cord injury was airlifted to AIIMS, Rishikesh.

Helicopters, sniffer dogs and thermal imaging technology were being used to expedite the rescue operation due to apprehensions about possible inclement weather on Monday, officials said.

Three bodies of the missing labourers were found on Sunday, district administration officials said in Gopeshwar. With this, the number of workers who lost their lives in the Mana avalanche mounted to seven. One person is still missing for whom the search is in progress, they said. Located three kilometres from Badrinath, Mana is the last village on the India-Tibet border at a height of 3,200 metres.

The bodies have been brought to Jyotirmath by helicopter where the post-mortem was being done at the Community Health Centre.

The deceased include Anil Kumar (21) from Rudrapur in Uttarakhand's Udham Singh Nagar district, Ashok (28) from Fatehpur in Uttar Pradesh and Harmesh from Una in Himachal Pradesh, the officials said. The lone worker who remains missing is 43-yearold Arvind from Dehradun.

Frequent trips abroad land IPS officer in soup



BSP rides on Behenji's Maya

The Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), once a dominant political force in Uttar witnessing is internal turmoil. In a major decision on Sunday, BSP supremo Mayawati removed her nephew, Akash Anand, from all party positions. This comes just days after she expelled Akash's father-inlaw, Ashok Siddharth, from the party.

At the same time, Mayawati elevated her brother, Anand Kumar, and senior leader Ramji Gautam, appointing them as national Addressing coordinators. party members, she made it clear that BSP would no longer operate on familybased leadership.

"As long as I am alive, there will be no successor in the party. Personal relations have

no significance when it comes to the party and the Ambedkarite movement," she asserted.

Mayawati emphasised that the party's welfare would always come before personal ties. "For me, the party and movement come first. My brother, his children, and other family members are secondary," she stated. She assured party workers that she would continue leading the BSP with full commitment and dedication until her last breath.

Justifying Akash Anand's removal, Mayawati pointed to the negative influence of his father-in-law, Ashok Siddharth, whom she accused of weakening the party by creating internal divisions. "Ashok Siddharth worked to split the party into factions across the country, including Uttar Pradesh. His actions during his son's wedding were

also concerning," she alleged. She further indicated that Akash Anand may have been influenced by his wife and inlaws, which posed a potential risk to BSP's future. "After expelling Ashok Siddharth, we have to seriously evaluate the extent of his daughter's influence on Akash. The signs so far are not positive,"

In a related decision, Mayawati revealed that her brother Anand Kumar has resolved to marry his children into non-political families. "This step has been taken to prevent any future damage to the party, as was the case with Ashok Siddharth," she said.

During the review meeting, Mayawati issued instructions for future party programs and strategies. She reiterated her stand that the Samajwadi Party (SP) and Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) are two sides of the same coin. Citing BSP's absence from the Milkipur bypoll, she questioned SP's tendency to blame BSP for its electoral losses. "Now that BSP did not contest the Milkipur bypoll, whom will the SP blame for its defeat?" she asked.

Mayawati reaffirmed her belief that only BSP, with its Ambedkarite ideology, can effectively challenge the BJP and other caste-based parties. "The people of this country must realise that the BSP alone can defeat the BIP and other parties that exploit caste politics," she declared.

On Ramazan, Israel cuts off aid to Gaza

srael stopped the entry of **L**all goods and supplies into the Gaza Strip on Sunday and warned of "additional consequences" if Hamas doesn't accept a new proposal to extend a fragile ceasefire. Hamas accused Israel of trying to derail the existing ceasefire agreement and said its decision to cut off aid was "cheap extortion, a war crime and a blatant attack" on the truce, which took hold in January after more than a year of negotiations. Both sides stopped short of saying the ceasefire had ended. First phase of the ceasefire,

which included a surge in humanitarian assistance, expired on Saturday.

The two sides have vet to negotiate the second phase, in which Hamas was to

release dozens of remaining hostages in return for an Israeli pullout and a lasting ceasefire.

An Israeli official said the decision to suspend aid was made in coordination with the Trump administration. There was no immediate comment from the United

States. Hundreds of aid trucks have entered Gaza daily since the ceasefire began on Jan. 19, and it was unclear what the

cutoff would be. ISRAEL SAYS THE NEW PROPOSAL IS BACKED BY THE US: Israel said the new proposal, which it said came from US Mideast envoy Steve Witkoff, called for extending the ceasefire through Ramazan and the Jewish Passover holiday,

Zoos battling reduced funding

While India's zoos have "notable" breeding progress endangered species under conservation programmes that started around a decade ago, a government panel says that persistent gaps in fun species management hinder their overall success.

The Central Zoo Authority (CZA), which is responsible for overseeing and guiding national-level ex efforts, conservation constituted a committee in 2023 to review and evaluate the state of conservation breeding programmes in zoos across the country.

In 2007, the CZA selected 74 species for breeding in 43 zoos. By 2014, 26 highpriority species shortlisted and breeding programmes began for 23. According to the report of the committee submitted to the CZA recently, while India's zoos have made "notable progress in housing and breeding several endangered species, the overall effectiveness of conservation breeding programmes is hindered by persistent hindered by persistent foundational and operational challenges".

"Addressing these issues will require not only enhanced funding allocation but also comprehensive frameworks, adoption of standardised protocols, and

improvements in genetic and demographic management practices," it said.

The committee said that ₹10.81 Crore was allocated for conservation breeding between 2006 and 2011 and ₹18.13 Crore between 2011 and 2021. Over time, with the decrease in the CZA's funding, zoos now receive limited financial support, mainly for maintenance. 'This reduction in financial assistance has had cascading effects on implementation and sustainability of these programmes," the report said.

According to the report, Artiodactyla (even-toed ungulates), Carnivora (meatmammals) and Galliformes (game birds) are among the most targeted groups. However, many of their breeding programmes have either not started or are poorly managed. The report said errors in

species identification, such as with the Alpine Musk Deer

and Himalayan Serow, make managing populations difficult. The committee also highlighted that lack of genetic diversity, improper tracking and poor recordkeeping reduce the success of breeding conservation

programmes. While some successes, such Gaur and Indian Chevrotain, demonstrate potential for growth and recovery, they also "expose broader challenges including inconsistent record-keeping, uncoordinated transfers and inadequate husbandry practices", the committee said.

Primates, Squamata (reptiles), and Perissodactyla (odd-toed ungulates) struggle with low birth rates and poor genetic diversity. Animals like the King Cobra and Western Hoolock Gibbon have environmental needs that are not being met, which reduces their chances of successful

Youths into excessive social media suffer sexual ailments

The university's psychiatry department has observed a concerning trend, with nearly 90 per cent of patients aged 16 to 25 seeking treatment for sexual health issues identified as heavy social media users. Experts at KGMU attribute this rise to excessive exposure to unrealistic digital content, which is altering brain

relationships. real-life toward Professor Adarsh Tripathi, head of the Sexual and Marital Wellness Clinic at KGMU's psychiatry department, revealed that the outpatient revealed department (OPD) receives 10 to 12 youngsters daily with sexual health concerns, a significant portion of whom exhibit compulsive social media consumption habits.

Most of them spend a large part of their day scrolling through reels, shorts, and explicit images. This continuous exposure conditions their brains to expect exaggerated and often unattainable forms of intimacy, making them less sensitive to real-life responses and diminishing sensitivity relationships," Prof. Tripathi explained. Permanent power connection to farmers for Rs 5: CM

hief Minister Mohan Yadav has announced ✓ that farmers will now be provided with a permanent electricity connection for just Rs 5. Directing the immediate implementation of this scheme in the central region, he stated that it would be gradually extended across the entire state. He emphasized that this is a government dedicated to farmers, committed to making every possible effort to improve their lives. The state government aims to make farmers selfreliant in electricity production through solar pumps. Over the next three years, 30 lakh solar pumps will be provided to farmers, freeing them from electricity bills. Each year, 10 lakh connections will be given. Additionally, arrangements are being made to ensure 24-hour

electricity supply for farmers. The electricity generated by farmers through solar energy will be purchased, and they will be paid in cash.

Dr. Yadav made these announcements while addressing farmers who had gathered at the Chief Minister's residence for the Kisan Aabhar Sammelan Gratitude (Farmers Conference). Farmers from various regions of the state welcomed Chief Minister Dr. Yadav with a floral shower. In a grand gesture, they honored him with a traditional safa (turban), garlands, shawls, sacred coconuts, and symbolic gifts, including replicas of bullock carts and plows. Hoshangabad MP Shri Darshan Singh Chaudhary presented Ram Darbar mementos to all

Yadav assured the farmers that the state government is con-

tinuously working in their interest. He highlighted that wheat is being purchased at a support price of Rs 2,600 per quintal, which includes a Rs 175 bonus. Additionally, for 2024, the government will provide a Rs 4,000 per hectare incentive

for paddy procurement.
To support farmers further,
permanent electricity connections will be provided through solar pumps. Recently, 1.5 lakh farmers with temporary connections were given permanent ones at a reduced cost. Farmers with 3 HP pumps will pay only 5% of the cost, while those with 5 to 7.5 HP pumps will contribute 10%.

Yadav emphasized that the government, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership,

deeply cares for farmers. He highlighted the PM's initiative of free food grain distribution to the underprivileged, ensuring over 100 crore people receive food till 2028, with an expenditure of Rs 2 lakh crore. This, he said, reflects the Prime Minister's vision of "Ram Raiya", where every citizen's

well-being is prioritized.
The Chief Minister stated that PM Modi is ensuring farmers receive their rightful benefits, and the government's compassionate approach is a testament to this commitment. Dr. Yadav urged farmers to adopt crop rotation, shifting from paddy cultivation to groundnuts and other natural crops. He emphasized the need to establish Madhya Pradesh as a leader in organic farming. He acknowledged the GIS Bhopal summit's role in recognizing farmers' contributions.

Additionally, he mentioned that a revolution in cotton production is on the horizon. To support this, textile mills that employ family members of farmers will receive a Rs 5,000 bonus. The government is committed to promoting agricul-ture-based industries in the state. To increase per capita income, the government will provide bonuses for milk production, similar to the incentives for wheat and paddy. Farmers with more than 10 cows will receive subsidies, and village-level dairy farming and cattle rearing will be promoted with financial assistance. Support for gaushalas (cow shelters) will also be increased, with subsidies raised from Rs 20 per cow to Rs 40 per cow. Large cow shelters with a 10,000 capacity will be built in major cities, including Bhopal, for stray and elderly cows.

Timely blood donation at AIIMS Bhopal saves pregnant woman

n a remarkable display of humanity and generosity, a timely blood donation saved the life of a term pregnant woman at AIIMS Bhopal. The patient, admitted for delivery, was diagnosed with the extremely rare Bombay blood group, a condition that makes finding a compatible donor exceptionally challenging.

Upon receiving the emergency request, Mr. Ravindra, a selfless donor from Shirdi, traveled overnight, covering nearly 700 kilometers, to reach Bhopal and donate his blood. His swift and noble contribution ensured that the patient received the necessary transfusion, enabling a safe delivery. His transportation was arranged free of cost by Mr. Ashok Nair, who runs the NGO 'Blood Call Center', demonstrating the power of community-driven support in critical medical situations.

The Bombay blood group is one of the rarest blood types, found in only 1 in 10,000 to 1 lakh individuals in India. Due to its extreme rarity, identifying a suitable donor often becomes a major challenge. 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New film tourism policy to boost cinema, employment: CM

hief Minister Mohan Yadav said that Madhya ✓Pradesh has long been a favourite destination for filmmakers. Shooting in Madhya Pradesh has become even more attractive from a business perspective with the introduction of the state government's new Film and Tourism Policy-2025. He emphasized that this policy would enhance the state's global image by showcasing its beauty on the big screen while boosting the economy and generating employment opportunities. Chief Minister Dr. Yadav further remarked that the Golden Global Gate of film production and the tourism industry has been opened through the Global Investors Summit (GIS) in Bhopal. He highlighted that

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, during the inauguration of GIS-Bhopal, underscored the pivotal role of technology, textiles, and tourism in India's development. By the year 2047, tourism is expected to contribute over 10 percent to

India's GDP. The Tourism Department's presentation of the new Film and Tourism Policy at GIS-Bhopal captivated film producers and key players in the tourism industry. They expressed confidence that the policy would create a more favourable investment climate in the state while fostering long-term growth in the sector. As a result, investment proposals worth over Rs 68 thousand crore have been received in tourism, film tourism, and the hospitality sector. This massive investment is expected to generate 1.2 lakh new jobs, significantly boosting the state's tourism

The new Film-Tourism Policy

has significantly increased grant amounts for the production of films and web series, making Madhya Pradesh a more attractive destination for filmmakers. Under the revised policy, the following grants will be provided: Rs 5 crore for feature film production, Rs 2 crore for web series production, Rs 1.5 crore for TV serial production, Rs 50 lakh for documentary film production, Rs 12 crore for international films and up to Rs 20 lakh for short film production. To avail of these benefits, at least 75 percent of the film's production must be shot in Madhya Pradesh. The policy also emphasizes attracting investment for the renovation of cinema halls across the state. Additionally, a single-window approval system has been introduced for film shooting permissions, which has now been included under the Public Service Guarantee Act to ensure a hassle-free process for filmmakers.

To promote regional languages and culture, the state government has introduced a 15 percent additional grant for films produced in local languages and dialects under the new policy. Priority will be given to films made in Malvi, Bundeli, Nimari, Bagheli, and Bhili. Additionally, a 15 percent extra grant will also be provided for films focusing on women and children.

MP to witness mix of intense heat, sporadic rains in March

adhya Pradesh is set to experience a mix of Lintense heat, heatwaves, cloud cover, and sporadic rainfall in March, according to the Meteorological Department. The first week will be dominated by cloud cover, while heatwaves are expected in the fourth week. Several districts, including Indore, Ujjain, Gwalior, Chambal, Sagar, and Rewa, are likely to experience heatwaves lasting three to four days. Light rainfall is predicted in some dis-tricts after March 20. The department has indicated that rainfall levels may remain below normal, while temperatures are expected to be above average throughout the month.

Over the weekend, strong winds and gram-sized hail were reported in more than 24 villages in Morena, causing damage to standing crops in villages such as Mrigpura, Leela Ka Pura, Maithana, and Hansraj Ka Pura. The summer months ahead are expected to be extremely hot, with heatwaves lasting between 15 to 20 days from March to May, peaking in April and May.

Weather predictions for March indicate that in the first week, temperatures in Indore, Ujjain, Gwalior, Jabalpur, and Narmadapuram divisions will be 2-3 degrees above normal, ranging from 16-18°C at night. Bhopal, Sagar, Rewa, Shahdol, and Chambal divisions will experience night temperatures between 14-16°C. Daytime temperatures will rise above normal, reaching 32-34°C in Indore, Ujjain, Gwalior, Chambal, Rewa,

Bhopal, Narmadapuram, Sagar, and Jabalpur will see temperatures between 30-32°C. No significant rainfall is expected, although cloud movement will continue due to a Western Disturbance.

In the second week, Indore, Ujjain, and Narmadapuram will see night temperatures rise 2-3 degrees above normal. Meanwhile, a cyclonic circulation over Gujarat will keep temperatures in Bhopal, Jabalpur, Sagar, Rewa, Shahdol, Gwalior, and Chambal divisions normal at 15-17°C. Daytime temperatures will remain above normal in Indore, Ujjain, Gwalior, Chambal, and Sagar, while other divisions will experience temperatures between 31-34°C. No rainfall is anticipated, but cloud cover is expected in the western and southern regions.

During the third week, strengthening north-western winds will push night temperatures up by 3-4 degrees, reaching 20-23°C in Indore and 19-21°C in other divisions. Daytime temperatures will rise significantly, reaching 34-38°C, which is 2-4 degrees above normal. Due to an interaction between the Western Disturbance and southeastern winds, parts of the eastern and southern regions may experience cloud cover and

drizzle with thunderstorms. The fourth week will witness continuous strengthening of north-western winds, leading to minimum temperatures of 22-24°C in Rewa and Shahdol, while in the rest of the state. including Bhopal, it will be 23-26°C, which is 3-4 degrees above normal. Maximum temperatures will be 37-40°C in Jabalpur and Shahdol divisions, while and 38-42°C in other regions.

The arrival of south-eastern winds may bring drizzle to Jabalpur, Shahdol, and Narmadapuram. The last few days of March may witness heatwaves for 3-4 days in Gwalior, Chambal, Indore, Ujjain, Sagar, and Rewa divisions, as well as in Rajgarh, Sehore, Vidisha, Betul, and Harda districts.

The Meteorological Department has predicted extreme heat for April and May, with temperatures likely to surpass 45°C in Gwalior, Chambal, Jabalpur, Rewa, Shahdol, and Sagar divisions. Bhopal, Indore, Ujjain, and Narmadapuram will also experience intense heat.

On the first day of March, cloud cover caused a drop in daytime temperatures in multiple cities, including Bhopal, Indore, Gwalior, and Jabalpur. In Gwalior, the mercury fell by 3.8 degrees, recording 29.8°C. A similar trend was observed in Betul, Dhar, Guna, Khandwa, Pachmarhi, Damoh, Khajuraho, Mandla, Narsinghpur, and Malajkhand.

Historical weather data from the last decade indicates that March in Madhya Pradesh is typically characterized by cold nights and hot days, often accompanied by sporadic rainfall. This trend is expected to continue, with maximum temperatures in Bhopal, Indore, and Ujjain likely to exceed 40°C, while night temperatures will range between 10-17°C. According to meteorologists, Gwalior exhibits the most significant temperature fluctuations in March, with nighttime temperatures sometimes dropping as low as 8°C. Jabalpur experiences warm days

Government to go tough on drug traffickers: Shah

three people were arrested and sentenced to 14 years in jail. In July 2022, the NCB in Madhya Pradesh's Mandsaur intercepted two vehicles in Shahdol and seized 123.080 kg of ganja. Four people were arrested in the case and sentenced to 12 years rigorous of imprisonment with a fine of Rs 2 lakh each.

In the Chandigarh Zone last year, a parcel containing two hockey sticks packed with 438 grams of opium was intercepted at DHL Express, Ludhiana, by the officers of the NCB.

Two arrested accused in the case were sentenced to three years of imprisonment by a Punjab court for their role in attempting to transport the opium to Canada. In another case, the NCB

arrested one person at the Chandigarh Railway Station in 2021 for possession of 390 grams of charas. The accused was formally

intercepted a Zimbabwean woman on her arrival at the

Cochin International Airport The examination of her luggage led to the recovery and seizure of 2.910 kg of heroin. She was subsequently arrested and a court in Ernakulam sentenced her to 11 years in jail.

In January 2018, the NCB seized 450 grams of charas, leading to the arrest of one person in Dehradun, who was later sentenced to one year in

In 2021, the NCB seized 1.950 kg of charas from the possession of two accused who were later arrested. A court in January 2025 sentenced the accused to 10 years in jail.

In February 2021, the NCB seized 681.8 kg of ganja in the Ranga Reddy district of Telangana. Eight accused were arrested and charged with drug trafficking. A local court sentenced them to 10 years in

The Lucknow Municipal ■ Corporation has issued a ₹28.42 Crore property tax notice to the Bharat Ratna Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee International Cricket Stadium, also known as Ekana stadium, officials said

on Sunday. The notice comes ahead of Women's Premier League matches scheduled this month and the Indian Premier League matches in April, raising concerns over their smooth conduct.

The stadium administration has termed the notice "unjust" and plans to meet Chief Minister Adityanath to seek relief. According to a statement from Additional Municipal Pankai Commissioner Srivastava, Zone 4 of the municipal corporation issued the notice on Saturday.

The amount includes ₹5.45 Crore in tax due since December 1, 2020, and an outstanding balance of ₹22.97 Crore, the statement said, adding, the decision has been taken as per legal provisions and will be strictly enforced.

Srivastava clarified that only the sports grounds and stadiums of governmentaided or recognised nonaided educational institutions are exempt from property tax. Since Ekana stadium does

not fall under this category, it is liable to pay the tax. "Ekana stadium hosts IPL professional matches, sports events and cultural programmes with ticket sales. Therefore, the property tax assessment is justified. Currently, only property tax is being levied, and there is no action on water or sewerage charges," Srivastava added. He said the stadium administration previously objected to the tax assessment, but those objections were deemed baseless.

Ekana stadium Director Uday Sinha called the notice "against the rules."
"We will soon meet the Chief Minister and seek justice," he told PTI.

Sinha questioned the rationale behind imposing a ₹28 Crore tax liability arguing that the Lucknow Municipal Corporation's provide rules exemption for all types of stadiums.

He also pointed out that the notice does not mention a deadline for payment and expressed hope that the issue would resolved affecting IPL matches. Ekana stadium is the home ground for IPL team Lucknow Super Giants and

is scheduled to host seven

IPL matches this season.

The National Green Tribunal(NGT)has asked the member secretary of the Uttarakhand Pollution Control Board (UKPCB) and the state's principal chief conservator of forests to appear before it in a matter regarding illegal felling of 176 trees in Udham Singh Nagar district.

The NGT was hearing a petition unauthorised felling of trees during the development of a residential colony by private persons in the district's Chandpur village.

In its order dated February 24, a bench of judicial member, Justice Arun Kumar Tyagi and expert member, A Senthil Vel said that according to a report submitted by a joint committee that was set up earlier, 176 trees were felled illegally and environmental compensation had to be

clarifies voter ID duplication

he BJP mounted fresh attack I on Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, after the Election Commission of India (ECI) on Sunday came out with clarifications regarding duplica-tion of Voters' ID card numbers, saying duplication did not necessarily mean fake ID cards. The Commission said that dupli-

cation of Electoral Photo Identity Card (EPIC) numbers might have taken place because decentralised, manual mechanism was followed before the voters' database was shifted to a digital platform adding the Commission would take steps to rectify things. In a statement referring to social media reports the poll panel said "it is clarified that while EPIC numbers of some of the electors may be identical, the other details including demographic details, Assembly Constituency and polling booth are different for the electors with the same EPIC

number. Irrespective of the EPIC number, any elector can cast a vote only at their designated polling station in their respective Constituency in their State or UT where they are enrolled in the electoral roll and nowhere else." Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee had earlier launched a scathing attack on the BJP Government for manipulating the ECI and influencing the Chief Election Commissioners in inserting fake names in the electoral rolls to influence the elections. She cites EPIC cards showing how the numbers of two cards were same whereas their holders were different.

"There are several people who are complaining that duplicate names from

Haryana or UP are appearing in their EPIC card numbers," Banerjee said adding this was a ploy to rig elections.

They did this in Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Haryana, Maharashtra and Delhi. The leaders there could not catch the trick of inserting the names of fake voters. But we have been able to catch their trick and we have directed the officials from the DMs and BDOs to the party workers and local leaders to start scrutinising the electoral rolls and catch the fake voters so that the BIP cannot bring in voters from Bihar, UP and Haryana to vote in Bengal," Banerjee said announcing a committee led by senior party leaders to start door-to-door scrutiny of the electoral rolls.

Meanwhile apparently taking a cue from the ECI clarifications BJP leader Amit Malviya attacked Mamata Banerjee for allegedly preparing excuses before an impending defeat in the next year's Assembly elections.

It is a pity that the Bengal Chief Minister is resorting to misinformation to lay the groundwork for her imminent defeat in 2026 and weaken votersconfidence in the electoral system," Malviya said.

My uncle had saved his sister by pulling her out of the river waters by her hair as she slipped below amid the commotion, says city-based advocate Niranjan Lal recalling the 1954 Kumbh Mela stampede stories he had heard from his aunt who survived it.

This was the first Kumbh in Allahabad after Independence, and the tragic incident took place on February 3 on the occasion of Mauni Amavasya. According to official estimates, several hundred had died in the stampede.

Seventy-one years later, a stampede took place on January 29, again on Mauni Amavasya day as a massive crowd sought to enter into the Triveni Sangam waters for the 'Amrit Snan'.

Lal, 67, and his wife were camping in a Swiss cottage in Sector 6 of Mahakukbh Nagar, when they got a call from their son at home late night, cautioning them not to go to the Sangam due to the stampede 'We didn't step out from the

camp until the sun came out, and at around 11 am, we went to Dashashwamedh Ghat on Ganga, located near Sector 6. There were huge crowds in the mela area, in the streets and at the ghat. We were aware of the tragedy that had unfolded a few hours ago, and therefore we were alert, and being a local resident knew what to $\bar{\text{do}}$ in case the crowd became unmanageable, Lal said.

"But, we didn't go back feeling fearful. My wife continued to camp until the 'kalpwas' period was over, continuing the multigeneration tradition of our fam-" he said.

Lal belongs to an old family of Allahabad (renamed Prayagraj in 2018), many of whose members have performed 'kalpwas' and bathing rituals at all Kumbh held here post melas Independence.

His wife, Saloni Niranjan kept the family tradition, and observed the rituals at Maha Kumbh this year, after her mother-in-law's death in 2019. We were married in 1988, and

A clash of diplomacy and dignity

A dramatic Oval Office face-off between Trump and Zelensky, marked by sharp exchanges, underscores global political instability

n a high-stakes meeting that captured global attention, President Donald Trump and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky clashed in a dramatic showdown at the White House. What began as cordial greetings quickly spiraled into an explosive exchange, leaving Zelensky visibly humiliated on the world stage—even as his defiant stance earned him renewed backing from European leaders. The encounter marked the first in-person meeting between Trump and Zelensky since Trump's return to power in January. Early on, smiles and handshakes gave way to heated words as US Vice President JD Vance pushed for a diplomatic resolution to the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict. Vance's remarks underscored a fundamental point: the need for serious diplomacy to end the war, while also implicitly contrasting Trump's previous approach with that of past administrations. However, as the dialogue unfolded, Zelensky's pointed references to the long history of inaction—citing the annexation of Crimea and subsequent military struggles—sparked



a vehement rebuttal. In a sequence of rapid-fire exchanges, Trump dismissed Zelensky's critiques and reminded him of the overwhelming military support provided by the United States, arguing that without this aid, Ukraine's resistance could have crumbled in days. Despite the abrasive tone and what many saw as a public humiliation, Zelensky's resistance during the meeting resonated far beyond the confines of the Oval Office. While Trump's unconventional style and bombastic rhetoric further alienated many European policymakers, Zelensky's defiant posture emerged as a symbol of unwavering national resolve. European leaders, long critical of Trump's erratic diplomacy, viewed

the exchange as evidence that Ukraine needed to assert its own dignity in the face of American grandstanding. Moreover, Trump's harsh social media post demanding Zelensky "come back when he is ready for peace"—served not only as a dramatic moment of political theatre but also as a catalyst for European unity in support of Ukraine. Zelensky's refusal to be cowed sends a powerful message to both his domestic audience and international supporters. The Zelensky US visit might strengthen Ukraine's negotiating position and ensure a more coordinated effort to counter Russian advances. Trump's return to a more unpredictable form of diplomacy has underscored deep-seated divisions within the international community. His blunt dismissals and confrontational tactics risk undermining the credibility of traditional US diplomatic channels, potentially destabilising longestablished alliances. In contrast, Europe's reaction suggests a pivot towards a more measured, collective response that prioritises multilateral engagement over unilateral posturing. This divergence could reshape how global conflicts are addressed in the future, signaling a shift away from "big talk" and towards pragmatic, alliance-based strategies. The Oval Office showdown will likely be remembered as a defining moment in the ongoing Ukraine war and in the evolution of American foreign policy.

Breakthrough 'Bedi cooling turban' a glimmer of hope for brain stroke



This innovative device selectively cools the brain—bypassing the complications of whole-body hypothermia—and comes in handy in the treatment of brain stroke

t the recently concluded 71st Annual Conference of the Indian Association of Cardiovascular and Thoracic Sciences, Dr Harinder Singh Director Cardiovascular and Thoracic Sciences at Park Grecian Hospital in Mohali, presented a groundbreaking technique designed to protect the brain from oxygen deprivation during surgery. Nicknamed the "Bedi Cooling Turban," this innovative method is a trailblazer in more ways than one.

It is well known that lowering the temperature of an injured organ can help reduce damage. However, the brain presents a unique challenge because whole-body cooling introduces its own set of complications, and in brain surgery, only the brain needs to be cooled. Even a brief period of oxygen deprivation can result in devastating consequences, such as a massive stroke.

Dr Bedi conceived the idea during intensive brainstorming sessions and set out to cool only the brain. Drawing on his vast experience, he designed a unique cooling

turban made of plastic tubes arranged in a coil. Once the patient is anesthetised, the device is placed around the head and cold, sterile water is pumped through the coils using a specialised machine, cooling the brain while leaving the rest of the body unaf-

To date, this device has been successfully used in 48 cases to repair blockages in brain arteries, preserving brain

function throughout. Dr Bedi refined his surgical skills in advanced cardiovascular techniques at Escorts Heart Institute and St Vincent

Hospital in Sydney, where he managed cases using wholebody cooling (hypothermia) to preserve organ function. At the conference, the technique received an enthusiastic response from 1,700 national and international expert

Dr Rajneesh Malhotra, Cardiac Director at Max Hospitals, expressed particular enthusiasm, suggesting that the technique be applied to more clinical cases to further safeguard patients' brain function. He noted that innovations like this empower Indian surgeons to tackle

cases that might otherwise

seem hopeless. Dr Bedi confirmed that he plans to patent the technique and publish his findings so that it can be adopted worldwide to benefit similar cases. In conclusion, Dr Harinder Singh Bedi's innovative "Cooling Turban" technique represents a significant advancement in brain-protective strategies during cardiovascular and thoracic surgeries. By focusing cooling efforts solely on the brain, this breakthrough minimises the risks associated with wholebody hypothermia and opens new avenues for treating oxygen deprivation during

With successful application in 48 cases and enthusiastic endorsement from leading experts, this pioneering approach underscores the ingenuity of Indian medical innovation. Dr Bedi's commitment to patenting and sharing his findings promises to influence global surgical practices, ultimately saving countless lives and setting a new standard in patient care with excellence.

Is Forest Rights Act driving deforestation?



Despite its noble intent to secure the livelihoods of tribals, the Forest Rights Act has inadvertently opened the door to rampant deforestation and widespread encroachment

he law has been enacted to confer rights over the use of for-est lands by individual tribal or forest dwellers under their occupation on the prescribed cutoff date. Besides the individual rights, there is also provision for community rights over certain forests for benefits of collection of usufructs like beedi leaves, minor forest produces, grazing, fishing etc. and rights can also be conferred to the communities for sustainable management of forest

But the rights can be granted only when they are in actual possession of the forest land or have been enjoying the usufructs or sustainably managing the forest resources on or before 13-12-2005 for tribal and three generations (75 years) before this date for other traditional forest dwellers (OTFDs). Despite opposition from foresters, conservationists and environmentalists the law was enacted by the UPA government supported by left parties in 2005. This was followed by notifying the rules and the implementation from January 1, 2008.

Dipak Sarmah who succeeded me as the head of Karnataka Forest Department on my superannuation has observed on page 154 of his book titled, 'Forests Of Karnataka - Why And How Of Where They Are, "Most of the benefits that had accrued in the forests since the 1980s by way of forest consolidation due to implementation of Forest (Conservation) Act appear to have been nullified as a result of the implementation of the Forest Rights Act. The ominous signs of fragmentation and loss of forests are already discernible in a number of states as evident from the biennial India State of Forest Reports published by the Forest Survey of India,

A clearer picture will emerge in about a decade or so, by which time we would come to realise the true impact of the Forest Rights Act on our forests. But it may be then too late to retrieve the losses. Foresters alone cannot prevent the unauthorised removal of trees and the destruction of forests. Villagers set fire to burn the wood and grab the land. Forests are perpetually subjected to encroachments with the support of local leaders. Even if police presence is ensured and the community's resistance is bulldozed while removing encroachments, the problem resurfaces and lands are again grabbed. Political leaders question the removal of cultivation when land is devoid of tree growth. Fresh plantations are damaged and the forest area is re-encroached. Practically all encroachments till 25th October 1980, when the Forest (Conservation) Act came into operation were already regularised by the Union Government.

The Act was operational from 2008 with the new cutoff date of 13-12-2005. It was only the vote bank; the OTFDs were brought in to benefit from the legislation though their encroachments till 25th October 1980 were regularised. It can be understood that OTFDs cannot have more than a generation-old encroachment on the new cutoff date, yet a floodgate of forest destruction was opened for them. Without having any consideration for the ecological security of the country, OTFDs went on a rampage, cleared the fresh tree growth, occupied lands and claimed rights. Ministry of Tribal Affairs, the nodal agency for implementation took up several reviews to monitor the progress of the

states, further diluting the provisions in 2012 to ignore the only scientific evidence of satellite imagery interpretation among the evidence to be relied on in support of the claim. The claims of the tribal community, who had only to prove the occupation as of December 2005 were easily acceptable initially, but that too is now two decades old. Left-leaning forces and NGOs fought for claim cases of individual forest rights (IFR), community forest rights CFR) and rights to manage the forest resources sustainably.

This has accelerated the deforestation. IFRs have already been granted to 2.2 million tribal and OTFDs, covering nearly 5 million ha of forest land. Several activists have written articles in newspapers and magazines showing a satisfactory performance over the grant of IFRs and suggesting the states focus their attention on CFRs and grant of forest rights for sustainable management to avail the provisions that have been neglected by the states so far. The estimates of the activists suggest that 30 million hectare forest lands comprising more than 40 per cent of the total forest area can be granted for CFRs and sustainable management.

They further argue that if this is done, it has the potential to secure the rights and livelihood of 200 million people including 90 million tribal. Local press in Hyderabad has recently brought out that seven lakh acres of forests have been occupied in 2022-23 and claims over four lakh acres for tribal were approved in Telangana before the 2023 Assembly election. State machineries have accepted the claims overlooking the reports of the concerned divisional forest Environmental Development Society, Hyderabad, accused the state of pressurising officials for recognition of rights to ineligible individuals resulting in largescale deforestation leading to the scam of unprecedented propor-There are reports from

Rampachodavaram Forests division, Rajamundri (AP) that tribal department officials are granting rights in Papikonda National Park for money. A retired IFS M Padamanaba Reddy has filed a PIL for the scam. In February 2019, just before the Lok Sabha polls, states moved the Supreme Court to review its order of eviction of rejected IFR claims and allow them to re-verify. The court accepted it, but so far the states have not concluded and continue to accept the fresh claims. What signal does it send down the

The Act has provided unlimited time for filing claims and deforestation and bringing the land under plough can continue. No one has any concern about the ecological security of the country. It is to be understood that all rejected claimants are in occupation of the forest land, where they have already been successful in deforesting and clearing the area. More rejected claims are encouraged, and more deforestation takes place.

The only place where the CFRs and rights to manage the forests sustainably have been granted is the Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra. Section 3-1 (i) of FRA 2006 is relevant here, where rights can be granted to villages of Gram Sabha who have the experience of managing the area sustainably. Further the requirement

essential for the grant of rights i.e. they should have the resource as on 13-12-2005 for tribal and 75 years before this date for OTFDs. Management rights have been granted in many Gram Sabhas of Gadchiroli overlooking both the provisions

Activists are taking this example all over the country and pressing for a repeat of this. This has been frequently quoted example in articles and papers. What these authors have been hiding is the destruction of forests. Forest areas given for the sustainable management of Gram Sabhas have been devastated, degraded and frag-

There are patches of bamboo forests in Medha Lekha Gram Sabha where all bamboo clumps were cleared in one stroke in 2012. Forest officers were physically prevented from entering the area. Bampoo has not responded well to the clear feeling. The fresh regeneration is bushy and does not yield any usable bamboo culm. It yielded certain culms every four years when it was managed by the Forest Department.

The management of Medha Lekha Gram Sabha has not been sustainable and the area has not yielded culms in 2016, 2020 and 2024. Taking a cue from Madha Lekha, other Gram Sabhas have also started clear felling and overexploitation of the resource. Further, the revenue realised from the sale proceeds has not been ploughed back for fresh regeneration activities and the management has become completely unsustainable.

The meeting at Lancaster House, a 200-year-old elegant mansion near Buckingham Palace, follows a charm offensive last week to engage with Trump at the White House to put Ukraine at the centre of negotiations and tilt his allegiances toward Europe. British Prime Minister Keir

Starmer, who is hosting the leaders of more than a dozen countries and other officials, said he is determined to find an end to Russia's war on Ukraine. 'We have an opportunity to come together to ensure a just and lasting peace in Ukraine that secures their sovereignty and security," Starmer said in advance. "Now is the time for

Ukraine, protect European security, and secure our collective future?

The summit will also include leaders from France, Germany, Denmark, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Spain, Canada, Finland, Sweden, the Czech Republic and Romania. The Turkish foreign minister, NATO secretary-general and the presidents of the European Commission and European Council will also attend. Zelenskyv received broad sup-

port from leaders across Europe after the White House fiasco, which was exceptional for featuring an attack on an ally — and because it was broadcast on live television. Starmer embraced Zelenskyv

a get-together had been scheduled before the summit.

"As you heard from the cheers on the street outside, you have full backing across the United Kingdom," Starmer said. "We stand with you, with Ukraine, for as long as it may take."

Europe has been uneasy since Trump initiated direct peace talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin, who had been isolated by most Western leaders since invading Ukraine three years ago.

The scramble to remain relevant and protect European interests as their once stalwart ally appeared to be cozying up to Putin was even more trou-bling when Trump called Zelenskyy a dictator and falsely said Ukraine started the

Meetings in recent days had provided some hope — until Zelenskyy's visit to the White House.

Visits to the Oval Office by French President Emmanuel Macron, who had declared his visit a "turning point", and Starmer were seen as steps in the right direction. The meetings were cordial and Trump even took a gentler tone toward Ukraine though he would not commit to providing US security guarantees and maintained Europe would need to provide

peacekeeping troops. Within 12 hours of Starmer's return from Washington, the talk of peace seemed to collapse as Vice President ID Vance berated Zelenskyy for challenging Trump's assertions that Russian President Vladimir Putin could be trusted.

"Starmer did an impressive job of asserting Europe's agency in the war on Ukraine and conitation exercise. It's going to us to unite in order to guaranhave to be an exercise in where tee the best outcome for private meeting — a day before that Europe is willing and able veying to President Trump

to take a leading role in implementing any credible peace deal," said Rachel Ellehuus, director-general of Royal United Services Institute, a defence and security think

"Unfortunately, Friday's White House meeting was a major step backward.

Ukraine can no longer count on military or political support from the US after Trump declared himself neutral in negotiations, Ellehuus said. She said Europe needs to step in and could release some 200 billion euros (USD 207 billion) in seized Russian assets to help fund that effort.

"The immediate goal of the meetings in London must be to keep Ukraine in the fight so it can negotiate from a maximum position of strength," she said. Starmer pledged this week to boost military spending to 2.5 per cent of gross domestic product by 2027. Other European nations may follow

Czech Prime Minister Petr Fiala said Saturday that Europe faces a historic test and has to care for itself. He said European countries have to increase their arms spending to reach at least 3 per cent of GDP.

"If we don't increase our effort fast enough and let the aggressor dictate its conditions we won't end up well," he said. Macron, who said it was legit

imate for the US to shift its focus to dealing with China and Asia, also called for more defense spending as he called for unity among his neighbors. "We should have woken up earlier," Macron said. "I've been saying for years that we need a more sovereign, more united, more independent Europe."

Private Iunar lander Blue Ghost aces moon touchdown

Aprivate lunar lander carrying a drill, vacuum and other experiments for NASA touched down on the moon Sunday, the latest in a string of companies looking to kickstart business on Earth's celestial neighbour ahead of astronaut missions

Firefly Aerospace's Blue Ghost lander descended from lunar orbit on autopilot, aiming for the slopes of an ancient volcanic dome in an impact basin on the moon's northeastern edge of the near side.

Confirmation of successful touchdown came from the company's Mission Control outside Austin, Texas, following the action some 225,000 miles (360,000 kilometers)

'You all stuck the landing. We're on the moon," Firefly's Will Coogan, chief engineer for the lander, reported.

An upright and stable landing makes Firefly — a startup founded a decade ago — the first private outfit to put a spacecraft on the moon without crashing or falling over. Even countries have faltered, with only five claiming success: Russia, the US, China, India and Japan.

A half hour after landing, Blue Ghost started to send back pictures from the surface, the first one a selfie somewhat obscured by the sun's glare. The second shot included the home planet, a blue dot glimmering in the blackness of space.

Two other companies' landers are hot on Blue Ghost's heels, with the next one expected to join it on the moon later this week.

Blue Ghost — named after a rare US species of fireflies had its size and shape going for it. The squat four-legged lander stands 6-foot-6 (2 metres) tall and 11 feet (3.5 metres) wide, providing extra stability, according to the company. Launched in mid-January from equipment.

Florida, the lander carried 10 experiments to the moon for NASA. The space agency paid USD 101 million for the delivery, plus USD 44 million for the science and tech on board. It's the third mission under

NASA's commercial lunar delivery programme, intended to ignite a lunar economy of competing private businesses while scouting around before astronauts show up later this decade.

Firefly's Ray Allensworth said the lander skipped over hazards including boulders to land safely. Allensworth said the team continued to analyse the data to figure out the lander's exact position, but all indications suggest it landed within the 328-foot (100-metre) target zone in Mare Crisium.

The demos should get two weeks of run time, before lunar daytime ends and the lander shuts down.

It carried a vacuum to suck up moon dirt for analysis and a drill to measure temperature as deep as 10 feet (3 metres) below the surface. Also on board: a device for eliminating abrasive lunar dust — a scourge for NASA's long-ago Apollo

moonwalkers, who got it caked all over their spacesuits and

On its way to the moon, Blue Ghost beamed back exquisite pictures of the home planet. The lander continued to stun once in orbit around the moon. with detailed shots of the moon's gray pockmarked surface. At the same time, an onboard receiver tracked and acquired signals from the US GPS and European Galileo constellations, an encouraging step forward in navigation for future explorers.

The landing set the stage for a fresh crush of visitors angling for a piece of lunar

business. Another lander — a tall and skinny 15-footer (4 metres tall) built and operated by Houstonbased Intuitive Machines — is due to land on the moon Thursday. It's aiming for the bottom of the moon, just 100 miles (160 kilometers) from the south pole. That's closer to the pole than the company got last year with its first lander, which broke a leg and tipped over. Despite the tumble, Intuitive Machines' lander put the US back on the moon for the first

time since NASA astronauts

closed out the Apollo pro-

gramme in 1972.

US moves naval fllet to S Korea following missile tests by North

US aircraft carrier arrived Ain South Korea on Sunday in a show of force, days after North Korea test-launched cruise missiles to demonstrate its counterattack capabilities. The arrival of the USS Carl Vinson and its strike group at the South Korean port of Busan was meant to display a solid US-South Korean military alliance in the face of persistent North Korean threats, and boost interoperability of the allies' combined assets, the South Korean navy said in a statement. It said it was the first US aircraft carrier to travel to South Korea since June.

The deployment of the carrier is expected to infuriate North Korea, which views tempo rary deployments of such powerful ÛS military assets as major security threats. North Korea has responded to some of the past deployments of US aircraft carriers, long-range bombers and nuclear-powered submarines with missile tests. Since his Jan. 20 inauguration, President Donald Trump has said he will reach out to North Korean leader Kim Jong Un again to revive diplomacy.

Pope gets visit from Vatican secretary of state

stable Pope Francis had a A stable Pope Francis nad a visit Sunday from the Vatican secretary of state as he continued his recovery from double pneumonia, the Vatican said, but again skipped his weekly noon blessing to avoid even a brief public appearance from the hospital.

Instead, the Vatican distributed a message from the pope in which he thanked his doctors for their care and well-wishers for their prayers, and prayed again for peace in Ukraine and elsewhere.

"From here, war appears even more absurd," Francis said in the message, which he drafted in recent days from the Gemelli hospital, the Vatican said.

Francis said he was living his hospitalization as an experience of profound solidarity with ople who are sick and suffering everywhere,

"I feel in my heart the blessing' that is hidden within frailty, because it is precisely in these moments that we learn even more to trust in the Lord," Francis said in the text.

"At the same time, I thank God for giving me the opportunity to share in body and spirit the condition of so many sick and

suffering people." Signs point to a recovery: It marked the third weekend in a row that Francis has cancelled

the Sunday appointment delivering the Angelus prayer in person. He could have done so from his 10th floor hospital suite at the Gemelli hospital if

he were well enough But many signs indicated he

was recovering and improving. "The night was quiet, the pope is still resting," the Vatican said in its Sunday update. Cardinal Pietro Parolin and his

chief of staff, Archbishop Edgar Pena Parra, called on the pope Sunday morning, their second visit since Francis' February 14 hospitalisation, according to the Vatican spokesman, Matteo Bruni.

There were no details of what was discussed, but the mere visit suggested Francis' condi-

tion was stabilizing.
"The night was quiet, the pope is still resting," the Vatican said in its Sunday early update. He had no fever or signs of elevated white blood cells, which

would signal his body was still fighting an infection.

Doctors on Saturday reported that Francis was in stable condition, with no mention of him being critical. Their upbeat assessment came a day after a respiratory crisis that resulted in him being put on noninvasive mechanical ventilation.

But the 88-year-old pope had a "good response" in his gas exchange levels even during the "long periods" he was off the ventilator mask Saturday and only using high-flow supplemental oxygen, the Vatican

The fact that Francis was able to use just high-flow oxygen for long periods, without any significant effect on the levels of oxygen in his blood, was a sign his respiratory function was improving.

Doctors were cautious however and kept his prognosis as guarded, meaning he wasn't out

of danger. He was eating and drinking and continued his respiratory physiotherapy, and spent 20 minutes in his private chapel down the hall on Saturday, the Vatican said. The pope, who had part of one lung removed as a young man, has lung disease and was admitted to Gemelli on Feb. 14 after a bout of bronchitis worsened and turned into a complex

pneumonia in both lungs. Prayers continued to pour in: Francis' hospitalization has come as the Vatican is marking its Holy Year, drawing pilgrims to Rome from all over. They are walking through the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica and also making pilgrimages to the hilltop Umbrian town of Assisi, to pray at the home of Francis namesake, St. Francis.

"Every day we're praying for the pope," said the Rev. Jacinto Bento, a priest visiting Assisi on Saturday with a group of 30 Jubilee pilgrims from the Azores Islands. "We're very sad for his situation."

In an odd coincidence, Francis was supposed to have presided Saturday over a Holy Year audience in the Vatican's auditorium for the staff of the Gemelli hospital and other health care workers. They came as planned and completed the pilgrimage, while Francis continued his recovery at the hos-

US court rules head of watchdog agency must keep his job

The head of a federal watchdog agency must remain in his job, a judge in Washington ruled on Saturday, saying President Donald Trump's bid to remove the special counsel was unlawful.

US District Judge Amy Berman Jackson sided with Hampton Dellinger, who leads the Office of Special Counsel, in a legal battle over the president's authority to oust the head of the independent agency that's likely headed back to the US Supreme Court.

Dellinger sued Trump last month after he was fired, even though the law says special counsels can be removed by the president "only for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office." Jackson, who was nominated to the bench by Democratic president Barack Obama, quickly reinstated Dellinger in the job while he

Jackson rejected the Trump administration's claims that the special counsel's removal protections are unconstitutional because they prevent the president from rightfully installing

his preferred agency head.

The judge said allowing the president to remove the special counsel at will would have a chilling effect on his crucial duties, which include guarding the federal workforce from illegal personnel actions, such as retaliation for whistleblow-

The Special Counsel is supposed to withstand the winds of political change and help ensure that no government servant of either party becomes the subject of prohibited employment practices or faces reprisals for calling out wrongdoing — by holdovers from a previous administration or by officials of the new one, Jackson wrote in her decision.

The Justice Department quickly filed court papers indicating it will challenge the ruling to Washington's federal appeals court. The case has already gone up once to the Supreme Court, which previously temporarily allowed Dellinger to

remain in his job. The ruling comes as Dellinger is challenging the removal of probationary workers who were fired as part of the Trump administration's massive overhaul of the government. A federal board on Tuesday halted the terminations of several probationary workers after Dellinger said their firings may have been unlawful.

"I'm glad and grateful to see the court confirm the importance and legality of the job protections Congress afforded my position," Dellinger said in a statement on Saturday. "My efforts to protect federal employees generally, and whistleblowers in particular,

from unlawful treatment will continue. The judge said the special

counsel has a "unique status and mission," which requires independence from the president to ensure he can carry out his responsibilities. The office investigates whistleblower claims of reprisal, can pursue disciplinary action against employees who punish whistleblowers and provides a channel for employees to disclose government wrongdoing. "If I don't have independence, if I can be removed for no good reason, federal employees are going to have no good reason to come to me," Dellinger told reporters outside Washington's federal courthouse after a recent hear-

ing.
The Office of Special Counsel is also responsible for enforcing the Hatch Act, which restricts the partisan political activities of government work-

ers. Dellinger's firing came as Trump administration employees have touted their support on social media for his policies even though the Hatch Act is meant to restrict political advocacy while on duty. The Justice Department employed sweeping language in urging the Supreme Court last month to allow the termination of the head of an obscure federal agency with limited power. Acting Solicitor General Sarah Harris wrote in court papers that the lower court had crossed "a constitutional red line" by blocking Dellinger's firing and stopping Trump "from shaping the agenda of an executivebranch agency in the new administration's critical first

Dellinger was appointed by Democratic President Joe Biden and confirmed by the Senate to a five-year term in

Yawning wealth gap widening inequalities in China: Report

China's wealthiest individuals continue to grow richer, widening economic inequalities in the country despite the ruling Communist Party's efforts to control private businesses and implement policies aimed at boosting people's incomes, a report here said. The combined wealth of the

5.12 million families in China with over six million yuan (USD 824,000) in assets was stated to be about 150 trillion yuan (over USD seven trillion) in 2024, according to a report published by the Hurun Research Institute.

Of this, the wealthiest 130,000 families accounted for 58 per cent in 2024, which is up from 56 per cent a year earlier, the report said.

China's per capita disposable income was stated to be 41,314 yuan (over USD 41,314) last year, up 5.3 per cent from 2023, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported, citing the report. Analysts have warned that Beijing needs to work harder to narrow the wealth gap in society more broadly as it tries to

nomic recovery, the Post reported on Sunday.

As a result, the overall consumption essential to halt the economic slowdown grew by just 3.5 per cent last year, a rate that was slower than the 5 per cent rise in GDP, suggesting that the income and wealth gaps were holding back spending. The growing inequality was reflected in the national Gini coefficient, which was 0.467 in 2022 when the National Bureau of Statistics last updated the number.

A Gini coefficient of 0 reflects perfect income and wealth equality, while 1 reflects maximal inequality, where a single individual has all the income while all others have none.

The yawning wealth gap was also apparent in data from Shenzhen-based China Merchants Bank (CMB), one of China the country's biggest domestic wealth management-focused lenders.

CMB said that about 2.3 per cent of its accounts held roughly 81 per cent of the total private banking assets at the institution in 2023, representing a highly unequal distribution, the Post reported.

The Hurun report is published ahead of the upcoming annual Parliament session of the National People's Congress (NPC), which begins its twoweek-long session from March 5, during which several legislations to boost the country's economy were expected to be approved

The NPC would meet along with the advisory body, the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC), to deliberate on the state of the economy and the country's strategic challenges arising out of US President Donald Trump starting a sec-

ond stint in power.

Prez Trump signs order designating **English as official** language of US

President Donald Trump has signed an executive order designation utive order designating English as the offi-

cial language of the United States. The order allows government agencies and organizations that receive federal funding to choose whether to continue to offer documents and services in language other than English.

It rescinds a mandate from former President Bill Clinton that required the government and organizations that received federal funding to provide language assistance to non-English

"Establishing English as the official language will not only streamline communication but also reinforce shared national values, and create a more cohesive and efficient society," according to the order signed by Trump on Saturday.

"In welcoming new Americans, a policy of encouraging the learning and adoption of our national language will make the United States a shared home and empower new citizens to achieve the American dream," the order also states. "Speaking English not only opens doors economically, but it helps newcomers engage in their communities, participate in national traditions, and give back to our society."

More than 30 states have already passed laws designating English as their official language, according to US English, a group that advocates for making English the official language in the For decades, lawmakers in Congress have intro-

duced legislation to designate English as the offinot succeeded. Within hours of Trump's inauguration last

month, the new administration took down the Spanish language version of the official White House website.

Hispanic advocacy groups and others expressed confusion and frustration at the change. The White House said at the time it was committed to bringing the Spanish language version of the website back online. As of Saturday, it was still not restored.

The White House did not immediately respond to a message about whether that would happen. Trump shut down the Spanish version of the website during his first term. It was restored when President Joe Biden was inaugurated in

"We can get back at Elon," said

Musk's critics say his actions defy Congress's power to control the US budget and present a host of ways for him to enrich himself. Musk leads several other companies, notably SpaceX, which conducts launches for NASA and the intelligence community, and the social media platform

'Protests will not deter President Trump and Elon Musk from delivering on the promise to establish DOĞE and make our federal government more efficient and more accountable to the hardworking American taxpayers across the country," said White House spokesperson Harrison Fields.

Tesla did not respond to an emailed request for comment.

More than 50 demonstrations were listed Saturday on the website Tesla Takedown, with more planned later in March from coast to coast in the United States along with England, Spain and Portugal. News reports showed demonstrations in recent days in US cities including Tucson, Arizona; St. Louis; New York City: Dayton, Ohio; Charlotte; and Palo Alto, California. Some Tesla owners have also reported their vehicles vandalized with spray painted swastikas amid what Jewish groups and observers fear is a rise in antisemitism.

Federal prosecutors charged a woman in connection with a string of vandalism against a Colorado Tesla dealership, which included Molotov cocktails being thrown at vehicles and the words "Nazi cars" spray painted on the building. Saturday's demonstration in Boston

had a festive atmosphere, with a brass band playing music as protesters carried signs and chanted. Several of the signs mocked Musk and DOGE, with one reading: "Stop Elon and his despicable Muskrats.' This government led by

Musk, it's gone completely off the rails and we are here to stop that, said Carina Campovasso, a retired federal worker. "And I hope they listen." About 300 demonstrators protested at a Tesla dealership in New York City on Saturday. Police said nine people were taken into custody but did not elaborate on the charges they faced.

Tesla's share price has fallen by nearly a third since Trump took office, though it's still higher than it was a year ago. Musk's current net worth is an estimated \$359 billion, according to Forbes, which calculated his 2024 net worth as \$195 billion.

It remains unclear if the article was indeed penned by Khan, and how it was delivered to the magazine.



hand grenade attack on a police station in AKarachi has left senior officials concerned whether insurgent groups from Balochistan or the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) have become active in Pakistan's biggest city. Reza said in the past the criminal gangs in Lyari used hand grenades to attack police stations and mobile vans. Reza said the attack alerted police and security personnel as there had been very few such cases in Karachi

A⁴-year-old child became the second person to die of Ebola in Uganda, the World Health Organisation has said, in a setback for health officials who had hoped for a quick end to the outbreak that began at the end of January

The child had been hospitalised at the main referral facility in Kampala, the capital of the East African country, and died Tuesday, the WHO office in Uganda said in a brief statement on Saturday. The statement said WHO and others are working to strengthen surveil-

lance and contact tracing. There were no other details about the death and local health officials were not commenting on the case

The death undermines Ugandan officials' assertions of an outbreak under control after eight Ebola patients were discharged earlier in February. The first victim was a male nurse who died the day before the outbreak was declared on Jan 30. He had sought treatment at multiple facilities in Kampala and in eastern Uganda, where he also visited a traditional healer in trying to diagnose his illness, before later dying in Kampala. The successful treatment of

eight patients who had been contacts of that man, including some of his relatives, had left local health officials anticipating the end of the outbreak. But they are still investigating its source.

Tracing contacts is key to stemming the spread of Ebola, and there are no approved vaccines for the Sudan strain of Ebola that's infecting people in Uganda.

Over 20,000 travellers are screened daily for Ebola at Uganda's different border cross ing points, according to WHO, which supports the work.

The WHO has given Uganda at least USD 3 million to support its Ebola response, but there have been concerns about adequate funding in the wake of the US administration's decision to terminate 60% of USAID's foreign aid contracts. Dithan Kiragga, executive director of the Baylor College of Medicine Children's Foundation, a non-governmental group that supports Ebola surveillance in Uganda,

told The Associated Press on

Friday that his group had stopped its work supporting local health authorities in screening travelling passengers after the termination of its contract with USAID.

Government fails to find right candidate for BPCL top job

After Hindustan Corporation Limited (HPCL), government headhunter struggled to find a suitable candidate for the top job at Bharat Petroleum, as most applicants were narrow specialists lacking multidisciplinary experience needed to run a large organisation.

Enterprise The Public Selection Board (PESB) last month interviewed a dozen candidates including BPCL Vetsa director (finance) Ramakrishna Gupta and its director (refineries) S Khanna but found none suitable for the job of chairman and managing

(BPCL), according to a PESB order.

It advised the administrative ministry "to choose an In June last year, PESB appropriate course of interviewed further action for selection including the search cum selection committee, according to the order.

Incumbent G Krishnakumar superannuates as chairman and managing director of BPCL on April 30 this year. BPCL is the fourth company in the oil sector where PESB couldn't find a suitable candidate since 2021.

PESB in May 2023 did not make any recommendation for the top post at Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) and the task was then entrusted to a search cum selection

That panel picked Arvindar Singh Sahney who was appointed chairman of IOC in November 2024.

eight candidates, including director on HPCL board and managing director of Indraprastha Gas Ltd, for the post of chairman and managing director at HPCL but rejected them all.

HPCL top position has been lying vacant since August 31, 2024, when Pushp Kumar Joshi superannuated Previously in June 2021, PESB reached a similar conclusion while looking for a candidate for the top job at Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC).

A year later, a search-cumselection committee picked

appointments at public sector companies are done basis recommendations of the PESB but the government headhunter struggling to find suitable candidates for top jobs that fell vacant since 2021 in the oil sector. Most of the candidates who appeared for interviews for HPCL and BPCL had spent all their professional careers in just one stream such as only refineries, or LPG sales. "I wouldn't call them one trick ponies but they are all narrow specialists. When PESB looks at candidates, it than his core competence. essentially is looking for someone who has had multidisciplinary exposure and is capable of leading an organisation whose job is not limited to one discipline of refining oil or selling

BPCL created such leaders but unfortunately that is not happening now, he added. IOC's Sahney spent three decades in refinery operations, technical services, and health, safety,

and environment (HSE). He was an executive director in the business development division, handling

multidisciplinary exposure. Another official said the situation at HPCL is the most grim as potential candidates have spent all of their professional careers in just one or two disciplines. FPIs withdraw ₹34,574 Crore from equities in Februrary

 $F_{\text{pulled out }}^{\text{oreign investors have}} \xrightarrow{\text{have}}$ from the Indian equity markets in February pushing total outflows to ₹1.12 Lakh Crore in the first two months of 2025 amid rising global trade tensions and concerns over corporate earnings growth.

"Elevated valuations of Indian equities, alongside concerns about corporate earnings growth, have led to sustained outflow of FPIs, Bhowar, Senior Director - Listed Investments, Waterfield Advisors, said.

According to the data with the depositories, Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) offloaded shares worth ₹34,574 Crore from Indian equities in February.

This came following a net outflow of ₹78,027 Crore in the entire January. With these, the total outflow

by FPIs has reached ₹1,12,601 Crore in 2025 so far, data with the depositories showed. The massive selling by FPIs

has resulted in the BSE's benchmark Sensex falling over six per cent year-to-date. The recent market sell-off has been influenced by rising United States (US) bond yields, a strengthening US dollar, and global economic uncertainties, leading to a shift in investor focus towards US assets, Bhowar

According to him, the earnings reports for the third quarter of fiscal year 2025 have been modest, indicating an atmosphere of uncertainty. issue further compounded by falling commodity prices and reduced consumer spending, which adversely impact corporate profits diminish the appeal of Indian equities to foreign investors, he added.

"FPIs are focused on selling in India because valuations in India are high and moving money to Chinese stocks where valuations are much

"But in the process, they are selling in the best performing valuations," Chief Vijavakumar Investment Strategist, Geojit

Financial Services, said. An important paradox in FPIs selling is that they are selling heavily in financial services, the sector which is doing well and the valuations are attractive.

Additionally, they withdrew money from the debt market. They pulled out ₹8,932 Crore from debt general limit and ₹2,666 Crore from debt voluntary retention route.

The overall trend indicates a cautious approach by foreign investors, who scaled back investments in Indian equities significantly in 2024, with net inflows of just ₹427 Crore.

This contrasts sharply with the extraordinary ₹1.71 Lakh Crore net inflows in 2023 driven by optimism over India's strong economic fundamentals. In comparison, 2022 saw a net outflow of ₹ 1.21 Lakh

Crore amid aggressive rate hikes by global central banks.

Wages drag as employment rises: Virmani

PTI ■ NEW DELHI

Niti Aayog member Arvind Virmani has said that employment is increasing in India, real wages for regular jobs have not kept pace with inflation over the oast seven years.

India has an opportunity in terms of global population, and there is a need to take advantage of it. For this, improving the quality of teaching and training is important, he noted. In an interview with PTI-

Bhasha, he said, "According to Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) data, the workerpopulation ratio has been clearly increasing in the last seven years. This means that the number of jobs is increasing more than the population growth. There are fluctuations in this too but the trend shows that jobs are increasing. Therefore, it is wrong to say that jobs are not

increasing".

As per the PLFS Annual Report 2023-24 (July-June), the worker-population ratio in terms of persons of all ages increased to 43.7 per cent in 2023-24 from 34.7 per cent in2017-18.

"If we look at the wage data in PLFS, the real salary of casual workers has increased during the seven years and their condition has improved during this period. The figures confirm this.

"But a bigger issue is in the case of regular salaried jobs. In this category, real wages have not increased in line with inflation in seven years," the economist said. "As far as my assessment is

concerned, the main reason for wages not increasing as per inflation is the lack of skills. We are not hiring skilled jobs. I have seen the data of many countries. Based on that, I would say that we need to work on this (skill). It is in a

very weak state. The central government is taking steps. States also need to work in this direction, work needs to be done at the district level because jobs will be created there.'

This is important because skills increase, productivity increases and real wages increase. This happens in India as well as in the world. Skill development is needed not only for those who are already working but also for the new people who are coming in," the Niti Aayog member said.

Olympic nternational Committee **▲** president's post contender Sebastian Coe feels India's bid to host the 2036 Olympic Games is a "strong case" but competition will be tough with several other countries throwing their hats in the

India has already submitted a 'Letter of Intent' to host the Olympics 2036 Paralympic Games to the IOC's Future Host Host Commission, taking the first concrete step in an ambitious plan after months of informal dialogue with the global sport's apex body.

"Well, you won't be surprised given my background to say that I'm obviously very happy that India is committed to global sport and particularly the Olympic movement. I'm very happy to hear that.

"And look, it will be very competitive. It won't be the only bidder, but the case that it (Índia) can make is a very strong case," Coe told PTI in an exclusive interview.
Poland, Indonesia, South
Africa, Qatar, Hungary,

Turkey, Mexico and Egypt are among other countries which have expressed a desire to host the 2036 Olympics. The 2036 Games host nation

will not be known before 2026. But it is certain that the host will be chosen during the presidency of the winner of the March 20 election of the new IOC chief.
