HC stays order directing FIR against Buch, five others

The Bombay High Court on Tuesday stayed for four weeks a special court's order directing FIR against former Sebi chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch and five other officials for alleged stock market fraud and regulatory violations, noting it was passed mechanically.

A single bench of Justice Shivkumar Dige said the special court order of March 1 also did not attribute any specific role to the accused in the matter.

"After hearing all the parties concerned and after going through the order of the special court, it appears that the order is passed mechanically without going into details and without attributing any specific role to the applicants (Buch and others)," Justice Dige said. "Hence, the order is stayed till next date. Four weeks

time is given to the complainant in the case (Sapan Shrivastava) to file his affidavit in reply to the petitions," the court said.

The HC's judgement came on petitions filed by Buch, three current whole-time Sebi directors Ashwani Bhatia, Ananth Narayan G and Kamlesh Chandra Varshney, Bombay Stock Exchange's Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer Sundararaman Ramamurthy and its former chairman and public interest director Pramod Agarwal.

CBI nabs several rail officials in job racket

In a massive crackdown, the Central Bureau of Agency (CBI) on Tuesday said it has arrested 26 railway officials including a senior divisional electrical engineer of East Cental Railway for allegedly leaking papers of departmental examination and seized ₹1.17 crore cash during its raids.

The railway officials were arrested on Monday night for allegedly leaking papers of examination for the elevation to posts of chief loco pilot at Mughal Sarai, the agency said, adding the exam was to be conducted on Tuesday. Sources in the agency said that the examination has now been cancelled.

The arrest has come just a fortnight after the central probe agency had arrested five railway officers, including two of the Indian Railway Personnel Service (IRPS) posted at the Vadodara Division, for alleged bribery in favouring candidates in departmental examination, officials said .

"During the checks conducted by CBI, at three spots on the intervening night (March 3-4) at Mughal Sarai, a total of 17 candidates were found with photocopies of hand-written question papers," a CBI spokesperson said.

departmental All 17 candidates who are presently working as loco pilots had allegedly paid money for the question paper and were caught red-handed with the copies during the raid, he



said. "Overall, 26 railway officials (including the 17 aspirants) have been arrested in this case so far," the spokesperson said in a statement.

The agency has registered the FIR against a senior divisional electrical engineer (operations) who was given the responsibility for setting and preparing the question paper for the said examination. "He himself had written the questions in English and allegedly gave it to one loco pilot who in turn translated it into Hindi and further gave it to another official. The said official allegedly gave it to the candidates through few other railway employees," the

spokesperson said. Accused senior divisional electrical engineer (operations) is among the arrested officials, he said. "Searches were conducted at eight locations which resulted in recovery of $\overline{\mathbf{x}}1.17$ crore in cash. The amount was reportedly collected from the

Gujarat forms committee for **UCC** public input

The high-level committee constituted by the Gujarat government to draft the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) will hold public consultations and focus on equal rights for women and care for children, its chairperson Justice (retired) Ranjana Desai said on Tuesday The five-member UCC committee convened its first meeting in Gujarat at the state capital, where Justice Desai launched a web portal, www.Uccgujarat.In, to take suggestions regarding the UCC from the public, government agencies, NGOs, social groups, communities religious organisations and political parties.

"Our work starts today. The committee has been tasked with assessing the need for the UCC in Gujarat. We will come up with a draft after the exercise, and for that, we will hold public consultation," the ex Supreme Court Justice said. She said public consultation is a vital part of the exercise, and two sub-committees have been formed — one for public consultation and another to prepare the draft. The committee met at the Gujarat Bhavan in Delhi last month. Justice Desai said, "We will focus more on equal rights to women and care for children. There should be equal rights for marriage and divorce. Marriages and divorces will have to be registered, but rituals of marriage are not to be disturbed."

mid allegations of a cover-up on its Apart over electors having duplicate voter ID card numbers, the Election Commission (EC) on Tuesday asked all state Chief Electoral Officers (CEOs), District Election Officers (DEOs) and Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) to meet political parties regularly to resolve their issues according to procedure.

The directions came at a two-day conference of state CEOs amid allegations by the Trinamool Congress (TMC) that voters in different states had identical voter card numbers. This is the first such conference held since new Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Gyanesh Kumar assumed charge last month.

CEC Kumar directed officials to be approachable and responsive to political parties. He added that all party meetings at all statutory levels be held regularly to



resolve any issues within the existing statutory framework by the concerned competent authority ie ERO or DEO or CEO. The issue wise action taken report by each CEO is to be submitted by March 31, 2025 to their concerned DEC.

In his address, Kumar exhorted all officials to work transparently and fulfil all statutory obligations diligently and as per the existing legal framework - the RP Act 1950 and 1951, Registration of Elector Rules 1960, Conduct of Election Rules 1961 and the instructions issued

by ECI from time to time.

The Supreme Court has The Supreme Court has held using terms such as "miyan-tiyan" and "Pakistani" was not an offence of hurting religious sentiments though made in poor taste. A bench of Justices BV Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma therefore discharged a man in a criminal case filed by an Urdu translator and acting clerk Right to Information (RTI) in the sub-divisional office, Chas in Jharkhand. The February 11 court order It came on record that said, "The appellant is accused, Hari Nandan Singh,

accused of hurting the religious feelings of the informant by calling him 'miyan-tiyan' and 'Pakistani'. Undoubtedly, the statements made are poor taste. However, it does not amount to hurting the religious sentiments of the informant. Hence, we are of the opinion that the appellant shall also be discharged under Section 298 IPC.

Section 298 of IPC deals with words or gestures made with a deliberate intent to wound religious feelings.

However, he filed an appeal before the appellate authority, allegedly after manipulating the documents sent to him by the office through the registered post and making allegations false manipulation in the documents.

Following an investigation, the trial court ordered framing of charges against the accused also under Sections 353 (assault or criminal force on a public servant) and 504 (intentional insult) of IPC. The Jharkhand High Court dismissed the accused's plea for quashing the proceedings. While hearing the man's plea against the high court order, the bench discharged him of the offence of intentional insult observing "no act on his part that could have provoked a breach of peace" apart from Section 353.

PWD hands over parts of Delhi-Rohtak to NHAI for upgradation, maintainance

In a first, the Delhi govern-ment has planned to handover the maintenance of PWD roads in the city border areas to NHAI, with a 13.23 km stretch of Delhi-Rohtak Road being transferred to the authority as part of its initiative to strengthen road network. The move will also boost a larger infrastructure development strategy in the national Capital. According to the government, the 13.23 stretch from Peeragarhi Chowk to Tikri Border (Delhi-Haryana border) will soon be handed over to the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI). The stretch between Delhi -Rohtak Road has been described as the "worst road of the city". Rohtak Road is in a dilapidated condition due the rapid unplanned population growth along the stretch, and the inadequate capacity of drains to carry water from these areas

LG, CM launch bamboo plantation drive in landfill

Delhi Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena and Chief Minister Rekha Gupta launched a bamboo plantation drive at the Bhalswa landfill site on Tuesday and assured people that the area would soon be turned green.

Addressing reporters along with the chief minister and other ministers, the L-G Saxena said bamboo was chosen for the plantation drive because it releases 30 per cent more oxygen, requires less water and grow fast. "Within a year, when you pass this land-fill site, you will see a green patch instead of heaps of trash," said L-G Saxena.

He said efforts to reclaim landfill sites began two years ago and with the start of the plantation drive, the process of turning these areas into green zones has begun. The L-G reiterated the government's promise to make the city pol-lution-free and launched a

new initiative to convert the Bhalswa landfill near the northern border into a green patch of bamboo groves plant-ed on the land that has been cleared over the last two years. L-G Saxena said the land was cleared over the last two years and today around 2,000 bamboo trees were planted. "Today, 200 bamboo plants have been planted here. In the coming months, 54,000 more trees will be added," the L-G said, adding that once the plantation is completed, commuters will get to see green patches instead of towering garbage mounds. "We had promised to free Delhi of pollution and this ini-tiative marks the beginning of a cleaner and greener city," he

added. CM Rekha Gupta lauded the efforts of the L-G and the Central government while alleging that previous dispen-sations "only made tall claims" about tackling the landfill issue but failed to take concrete action. She further highlight-ed the Central government's role in utilising waste materi-al from landfill sites in various projects across Delhi, including DDA grounds. "The LG has played a crucial role in ensuring Delhi's transformation. His leadership has been like a shield, protecting the city and guiding its development,' Gupta said.

Promising to conduct monthly visits to monitor the project, CM Gupta said the Delhi government is working in mission mode and its results will be visible in the greening of this patch of land

We will visit all the three landfill sites and within one year we aim to lower the height of the mountains of garbage and develop green projects. The 'Double Engine' government will work with double speed as the government is in mission. "In a year, this place will be completely transformed into a green land. Our mission is to clean and beautify Delhi, and with a double-engine government, we will achieve this goal at double speed," she added.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on Tuesday said India's security apparatus must remain adaptive to emerging threats such as cyber and hybrid warfare as well as "space-based espionage". SC seeks details from election panel on disqualification of political leaders

n a significant development, the Supreme Court (SC) on Tuesday asked the Election Commission of India (ECI) to provide details of cases in where it had either removed or the country. reduced the period of disqualification from electoral rolls of leaders post their conviction in

criminal cases. A bench comprising Justices Dipankar Datta and Manmohan asked the poll panel to furnish within two weeks details of such cases in which it exercised its power under of People Act (RPA), 1951. Under the RPA, the period of disqualification from electoral politics post-conviction in criminal cases varies depending on the offence and sentence. In cases relating to imprisonment of two or more years, a person is disqualified from the date of conviction until six years after their release, even if they are out on bail or awaiting appeal. However, the ECI is empowered under Section 11 of the Act to remove or reduce the period of disqualification after recording the reasons. The bench said PIL petitioner Ashwini Upadhyay and others could file a rejoinder to the EC's response within two weeks after

the details were furnished by the poll panel.

The 2016 PIL, filed through advocate Ashwani Dubey, sought a life ban on convicted politicians aside from the expeditious disposal of criminal cases against MPs and MLAs in

On being informed that a sim-ilar plea of NGO Lok Prahari was pending and being heard by another bench, Justice Datta referred the PIL of Upadhyay to the Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna for clubbing them and listing them before one court. The bench said the matters should be listed expeditiously istrative order. SC seeks Telangana response on disqualification of turncoat MLAs

PTI NEW DELHI

The Supreme Court on Tuesday sought Telangana government's response on pleas against the purported delay by the Assembly speaker to decide on the disqualification of BRS MLAs, who defected to Congress, saying a timely decision was key and there couldn't be a case of "operation successful but patient is dead".

A bench comprising Justices BR Gavai and Augustine Gerorge Masih said the decision on pleas over the disqualification of the lawmakers "cannot go on till the end of the Assembly session".

The court also issued notices to the office of the speaker of Telangana legislative assembly, the secretary of assembly and the Election Commission. Responses were also sought from MLAs Danam Nagender, Venkata Rao Tellam and Kadiyan Srihari who were directed to comply before the next hearing on March 25.

"Every matter cannot be dealt with in a manner that the operation is successful but the patient is dead," Justice Gavai said.

Senior advocate CA Sundaram, appearing for BRS

leader Padi Kaushik Reddy, said not taking a decision by the assembly speaker amounted to a failure in performing the constitutional mandate. Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi opposed the submission and said a time frame couldn't be given to the speaker to decide the disqualification plea.

He said on July 1, 2024, the plea for disqualification was filed with the assembly speaker and on July 9, a petition was filed in the Telangana High Court.

"In a democracy, the process should not go on till the end of the term of the assembly and if it happens then what will happen to the democratic principles," Justice Gavai said. The court added, "People are not only interested in getting the law decided but also see how it affects them."

The bench said when the case was first listed on January 31, it deferred the hearing to February 10 and asked senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi whether the assembly speaker would like to express the timeline within which he would decide the disqualification

Rohatgi said no such statement could be made on behalf of the

speaker, the bench observed. "Singhvi and Rohatgi state that no formal notice was there and thus no reply could be filed. Even though it is hyper technical we don't want it to be said that the case was decided against principles of natural justice. Hence we issue a notice returnable on March 25," the bench said.

Activist blame administrative negligence for death in Uttrakhand avalanche

Social activists have blamed the death of eight workers in an avalanche that hit a BRO Mana camp at

Uttarakhand's Chamoli district last week on "administrative negligence" and said the lives could have been saved had the authorities paid heed to a snowslide warning. They also blame "reckless construction" works in avalanche-prone areas for the rise in snowslide incidents. Chandigarh-based The Defence Geoinformatics Establishment Research (DGRE) issued an avalanche warning for a 24-hour period at 5 pm on February 27 for places located above the height of 2,400 metres such as Chamoli, Uttarkashi, Rudraprayag, Pithoragarh and Bageshwar districts of Uttarkhand Uttarakhand.

The avalanche hit the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) camp in Chamoli between 5.30 am and 6 am on February 28, trapping 54 workers. While 46 of them were rescued alive, eight were found dead. Atul Sati, a social worker

Ioshimath Bachao Samiti said Sangharsh "administrative negligence" led to the death of the eight workers.

'There was an avalanche warning and authorities should have acted on time," he said.

Following the incident, the Uttarakhand government issued an advisory for tourists staying in skiing destination Auli which has no history of avalanches, Sati said and alleged that it

looks like an attempt to divert people's attention from the state's failure. 'When there was a warning and the authorities were aware that such a large number of workers were in

Mana, why weren't they advised to move to safety? asked another social activist. The weather office in Dehradun issued a yellow alert for February 27, two days in advance, predicting isolated heavy rain and locations snowfall in

situated at 3,500 metres and above. However, the State Emergency Operations Centre here alerted the district magistrates concerned on February 28 when the avalanche had

already hit the camp. Over the last four years, two dwelling units of BRO workers have been destroyed by avalanches in the Chamoli district alone. An avalanche in April 2021 destroyed a settlement of workers in Niti Valley adjoining the Indo-Tibet border, killing as many labourers.

Experts feel that the snowslides are a result of reckless construction being carried out in avalancheprone areas. Renowned geologist MPS Bisht, an expert on weather movements in the Kedar Valley, said the entire area is vulnerable to avalanches that keep coming from the Nar Parvat.

Construction activities are being carried out recklessly even in areas identified for vulnerability without over thinking the consequences, he said. "Disasters are the result of this.

Manoj Sharma, a bat factory manager, elaborated on the intricate process of batmaking.

'We use wooden clefts, commonly known as 'bangar,'

Singapore cane being the Rubber highest quality. two inserts-usually or three-are embedded within the handle to enhance grip and shock absorption. The standard bat dimensions include a height of 33.50

inches, a width of 4.25 inches, and a handle length of 11 inches, with a blade thickness between 35mm and 40mm." As Meerut's cricket bats continue to gain global recognition, their presence in the ICC Champions Trophy is a testament to the city's growing dominance in the

sporting goods industry. With the IPL on the horizon the demand for these expertly crafted bats is only expected to rise further.

Mayawati ousts nephew Akash Anand from BSP amid party revamp

The Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), once a dominant force in Uttar Pradesh, is experiencing a significant shift in leadership as party chief Mayawati looks to rejuvenate her party's fortunes. Recently, Mayawati made the bold decision to oust her nephew, Akash Anand, from all positions within the BSP, culminating in his expulsion. This unexpected move has sent ripples through the political scene. In its aftermath, figures like Rajya Sabha MP Ramji Gautam and Mayawati's brother, Anand Kumar, have emerged as key players in the party's restructuring, both appointed as national coordinators. This realignment signals a fresh direc-

tion for the BSP as it prepares for the 2027 Uttar Pradesh Assembly elections. Ramji Gautam, a trusted and low-key leader, has long been a loval aide to Mayawati. His decades-long association with the BSP has earned him a reputation as a steadfast party

worker. His elevation is widely seen as a move to strengthen the party's core Dalit support base, while distancing itself from controversial or inexperienced elements. Rajiv Ranjan, a analyst, points

out that Gautam's rise could help counter the perception environment,

that the BSP is losing its grip on Uttar Pradesh's complex caste dynamics. "The BSP has faced challenges since 2014, with its Dalit-Muslim vote base splintering. Gautam is seen as a disciplined leader who can help reconnect with the party's

traditional voters," he says. Once a formidable force in Uttar Pradesh, the BSP has seen a sharp decline in its electoral success in recent years. In the 2022 Assembly elections, the party secured just one seat. Even the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, which saw a marginal improvement with 10 seats, were mainly the result of an alliance with the Samajwadi Party (SP)—an alliance that quickly fell apart, leaving the BSP politically isolated.

In the current political environment, the BJP

dominates Uttar Pradesh, while the SP is positioned as the leading opposition. The BSP, which once presented itself as a strong alternative for Dalit and backward-caste voters, has struggled to retain this base, with many former supporters now aligning with the BIP or SP. Who Is Ramji Gautam?

Ramji Gautam, born on June 1, 1976, in Lakhimpur Kheri,

hails from the Jatav community. He has been a dedicated member of the BSP since his early days and became known for his organisational skills, particularly in Banda district, where he served as the party's coordinator. His steady rise culminated in his appointment as the BSP's national vice president in 2018.

Mayawati has referred to him publicly as her "brother," underscoring their close working relationship. Gautam's new role as national coordinator puts him in a crucial position to help rebuild the party's structure and improve its electoral prospects. One of Gautam's key tasks will be to strengthen the BSP's grassroots presence, which has dwindled over time. Following disappointing another performance in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, all eyes are now on the 2027 Assembly elections, where the BSP must recalibrate its strategy to regain relevance.

Mayawati's decision to remove Akash Anand marks a clear message that she alone remains the unchallenged leader of the BSP.

Securing the skies

With adversaries rapidly upgrading to next-generation aircraft, India must priortise air combat readiness

he Indian Air Force (IAF) is at a critical juncture, balancing the need for rapid modernisation with self-sufficiency under the 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' initiative. A recent report by the Empowered Committee for Capability Enhancement of the IAF, has identified key thrust areas and provided recommendations to address shortfalls and enhance the force's capabilities. The IAF is currently operating at 31 fighter squadrons, significantly below the sanctioned strength of 42 squadrons. The delays in the induction of the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Mk1A and the gradual phasing out of ageing Jaguar, MiG-29UPG, and Mirage-2000 present an urgent need for new acquisitions. The report underscores the necessity of accelerating the production of the LCA Mk1A, LCA Mk2, and the fifth-generation Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA). Besides, the need for additional Airborne Early-Warning and Control (AEW&C) aircraft, mid-air refuelers, and advanced missile systems is crucial for operational capabilities. The committee has



stressed the role of the private sector in complementing efforts by Defence PSUs and the DRDO to boost production capacity and efficiency in aerospace manufacturing. The slow pace of domestic fighter jet production has led to gaps in operational readiness, particularly when adversaries like China and Pakistan are rapidly modernising their air forces with fifth- and even sixth-generation aircraft.

The complex procurement process and lack of streamlined decision-making continue to delay critical acquisitions compromising the air strength. While progress has been made in indigenous defence production, there are still gaps in high-end technologies such as jet engine

development, advanced avionics, and stealth capabilities. The financial allocation for defence needs to align with modernisation goals, ensuring adequate funding for both indigenous projects and immediate acquisitions. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has directed that the committee's recommendations be implemented in a structured and time-sensitive manner to prevent further delays. The government must ensure the timely execution of the AMCA program and increase HAL's production capacity to meet annual fighter jet requirements. Besides, a reformed procurement mechanism, reducing bureaucratic delays, is essential to fast-track approvals and acquisitions. Strengthening collaborations with global aerospace leaders to bring in advanced technology while setting up domestic manufacturing hubs will help accelerate modernisation. Encouraging private defence manufacturers through policy reforms, incentives, and infrastructure support will boost selfsufficiency in aerospace production. The recommendations underscore call for urgent action and need for addressing systemic challenges, and fostering innovation through private sector involvement. Indeed, India must achieve a combat-ready and self-sufficient air force capable of countering emerging threats. The need for a modern and highly efficient Air Force is more critical than ever.



Russia China help Junta hold the fort



Myanmar's civil war sees resistance forces making major gains, yet the Junta retains key cities and economic hubs with China and Russia's backing

ast week, Home Minister Amit Shah held a review meeting of Manipur under the President's Rule and also discussed the trade routes to Myanmar with the border areas no longer under Junta's control. Myanmarese Generals have ruled the roost since 1962. Their fourth coup February 2021, is the longest but one which has met with the biggest resistance and for the first time, the Bmar (Burmese) joined the opposition which consists of Ethnic Armed Organisations (EAO), People's Defence Force (PDF) under National United Government (NUG), local militias and rebel groups all united in defeating the Junta.

Under Junta's rule organized crime of which it is beneficiary has risen phenomenally to USD 2bn in cyber scams and other frauds. Many Indians have been unsuspecting participants and victims. Never before has Resistance been so organized in its fight against the military; success has come without any unified command and what at best is coordinated operations like Three Brotherhood Alliance which launched Operation 1027 by three EAOs – TNLA, MNDAA, and AA.

The last of these – the Arakan Army – is militarily the strongest and operates in the Rakhine province in the south while the other two EAOs operate in the northern Shan state. Codename 1027 denotes the launch date of the massive offensive in the north on October 27, 2023.

China plays a double role: supporting the Junta as well as some of the EAOs. Lately, there has been a policy shift - full support to the Junta. But Chinese pronouncements are deceptive; best to go by Chinese deeds, not words.On the ground, in the fourth year of the war, the Junta has lost considerable ground but is nowhere near being defeated. On the scale of conflict measurement, Junta holds 21 per cent of the territory which consists of the precious Irrawaddy heartland of Bmars and includes the new cap-

rounded by the Arakan Army. Two military command headquarters and two air bases in the north and south have been taken by Resistance forces. Some 145 of 350 townships are lost by Junta which has also lost all trade routes/posts on the borders with Bangladesh, India, China, and Thailand. Only one trade route Moosa, is with Junta. The Resistance controls 42 per cent territory with the remaining being No Man's Land. More importantly, 80 per cent of people especially Bmars support resistance while only 20 per cent are with Junta. During previous uprisings, Bmar always supported the Junta. Corruption is endemic, top down and has eroded Junta's military capabilities. It has led to defections and desertions with fighting battalions down to 100 men against the standard 600 soldiers. Some 167 battalions appear to have been lost, and weapons sold resulting in low morale and scant will to fight. Casualties are numerous on both sides but no figures have been released. Junta commanders have made false claims about facts on the ground. Some ghost units are on the Orbat. Most supply lines have been rendered unusable for reinforcements.

RBI's Repo Rate cut: A golden opportunity for homebuyers

With the RBI lowering the repo rate by 25 basis points, home loan borrowers stand to benefit from reduced EMIs, making homeownership more affordable

Madam — The editorial, "A Fresh Start ... " (March 4, 2025), presents a positive outlook on the surrender of illegal arms in Manipur. However, as noted in the editorial, this is likely only a fraction of the weapons still in the possession of warring groups.Despite this development, nothing substantial has been done to bring lasting peace to the state-except for the resignation of the Chief Minister, who was widely seen as responsible for the unfortunate turn of events. The 60,000 displaced individuals forced into the forests must be allowed to return to their homes and lead normal lives. For this to happen, the government must establish an impartial administration that earns the trust of all sections of society.Symbolic gestures alone will not suffice; all looted and illegal arms must be surrendered to achieve real progress.

If both the state and central governments had been genuinely committed to fostering peaceful coexistence among the groups, the situation would not have deteriorated so severely for so long. Even after major incidents-including the looting of arms, around 250 murders, women being paraded nude, and places of worship being ransacked-the government's inefficacy remained glaringly evident. Yet, it took an inordinate amount of time to secure the Chief Minister's resignation. President's Rule alone cannot bring about meaningful change, as it operates under directives from the Home Ministry, which itself has been exposed for its lack of a clear strategy. True peace will return only when an impartial and competent administration takes charge. - ndia has vast industrial and agricul-tural capabilities across 800 districts, yet 40% of its merchandise exports originate from only 10 districts. Gujarat dominates this landscape with five key contributors: Jamnagar, Surat, Ahmedabad, Bharuch, and Kachchh. The other significant players include Mumbai and Pune in Maharashtra, Bengaluru in Karnataka, Kanchipuram in Tamil Nadu, and NOIDA in Uttar Pradesh. Alarmingly, Punjab home to a robust industrial base in textiles, bicycles, sports goods, engineering goods, tractors, agricultural implements and food processing—is conspicuously absent from this export powerhouse.

The 'One District-One Product' (ODOP) initiative was introduced to rectify this imbalance, but meaningful progress has yet to materialise. If India is serious about reaching its ambitious target of \$1 trillion in exports by 2030, it must expand its export landscape beyond this handful of districts.

The next wave of growth will undoubt-edly come from unlocking the potential of industrial hubs like Ludhiana, Jalandhar, Amritsar, Hoshiarpur and Mohali. These regions must receive robust, targeted policy support, a conducive environment and infrastructure development, and substantial financial support to enable Punjab's industries to compete with the

country's top export-driven districts. India's Global Export ChallengeIndia's share of global exports has stagnated for decades, hovering around 2% and current-ly at 1.8% as of 2024. Ranked 17th among the world's top exporters, India falls behind various developing nations like Mexico, which ranks 9th.

To achieve the goal of at least doubling India's merchandise export value from \$437 billion in FY 2023-24 to \$874 billion by FY 2030, a strategic overhaul is essential-one that prioritises the establishment of export hubs in underrepresented regions, particularly Punjab, entire of potential.

have proven again and again that there are no fundamental clashes of interest or geopolitiZelenskyy after his tempestuous meeting with Trump, following which he was asked to leave the White House.

not targeted at, dependent on, nor subject to any third party," Lou said in a veiled reference to the US-EU ties. The Trump-Zelenskyy fallout

The 10 per cent tariff that Trump placed on Chinese imports in February was doubled to 20 per cent, and Beijing retaliated Tuesday with tariffs of up to 15 per cent on a wide array of US farm exports.

It also expanded the number of US companies subject to export controls and other restrictions by about two dozen.

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said his country would slap tariffs on more than USD 100 billion of American goods over the course of 21 days. Mexico didn't immediately detail any retaliatory measures

The US president's moves raised fears of higher inflation and the prospect of a devastating trade war even as he promised the American public that taxes on imports are the easiest path to national prosperity. He has shown a willingness to buck the warnings of mainstream economists and put his own public approval on the line, believing that tariffs can fix what ails the country. "It's a very powerful weapon that politicians haven't used because they were either dishonest, stupid or paid off in some other form," Trump said Monday at the White House. "And now we're using them." The Canada and Mexico tariffs were supposed to begin in February, but Trump agreed to a 30-day suspension to negotiate further with the two largest US trading partners. The stated reason for the tar-

iffs is to address drug trafficking and illegal immigration, and both countries say they've made progress on those issues. But Trump has also said the tariffs will only come down if the US trade imbalance closes,

Apart from researching dragonflies and other insects, Hisahito told reporters he is also interested in studying ways to protect insect populations in urban areas. His other interests lie in growing tomatoes and rice on the palace compound. Because Japanese royals have to stay away from politics, members of the Imperial Family tend to study biology, literature and arts. Naruhito's specialty is water transport while his father, Emperor Emeritus Akihito who abdicated in 2019, researches fish. Hisahito's father, Crown Prince Akishino, is an expert of chickens.

Pope Francis no longer requires mechanical ventilation

Dope Francis had stabilised enough on Tuesday after two respiratory crises to be taken off noninvasive mechanical ventilation and resume receiving just high flows of supplemental oxygen via a nasal tube to help him breathe, the Vatican said. Francis, 88, woke up and was

resuming respiratory physiotherapy after sleeping through the night, the Vatican said. The Vatican said as of Tuesday morning, Francis no longer needed to wear the mechanical ventilation mask that covers his nose and mouth to pump oxygen into his lungs. He had to resume using the mask on Monday after suffer-

ing two respiratory crises that

required doctors to extract copious" amounts of mucus from his lungs Francis rested early Tuesday after he suffered further setbacks in his fight against double pneumonia: two new acute respiratory crises that required him to resume using noninvasive mechanical ventilation to

breathe In its early Tuesday update, the Vatican said: "The pope slept through the night, now rest continues.

Francis suffered the two crises Monday. Doctors extracted "copious" amounts of mucus that had accumulated in his lungs, the Vatican said in a late update. They performed two bronchoscopies, in which a camera-tipped tube was sent into his airways with a sucker

at the tip to suction out fluid. The 88-year-old pope, who has chronic lung disease and had part of one lung removed as a young man, was put back on noninvasive mechanical ventilation: a mask that covers his nose and mouth and pumps oxygen into the lungs. Francis remained alert, ori-

ented and cooperated with medical personnel, the Vatican said. The prognosis remained guarded, meaning he was not out of danger

Doctors didn't say if he remained in stable condition, though they referred to the crises in the past tense, suggesting they were over.

The crises were a new setback in what has become a more than two-week battle by the frail pope to overcome a complex respiratory infection. The Vatican said the mucus that had accumulated in Francis' lungs was his body's reaction to the original pneumonia infection and not a new infection, given laboratory tests don't indicate any new bacteria. Dr John Coleman, a pulmonary critical care doctor at Northwestern Medicine in Chicago, said the episodes were more concerning than the l ast one on Friday, in which Francis had a coughing fit, inhaled some vomit that needed to be extracted and then was put on the noninvasive mechanical ventilation for a day and then didn't need it anymore. The use of bronchoscopies

that they had to go in there and remove it manually is concerning, because it means that he is not clearing the secretions on his own," he said.

"He's taking little steps forward and then steps back," said Coleman, who is not involved in Francis' care.

Francis, who is not physically active, uses a wheelchair and is overweight, had been undergoing respiratory physiotherapy to try to improve his lung function. But the accumulation of the secretions in his lungs was a sign that he doesn't have the muscle tone to cough vigorously enough to expel the fluid. Doctors often use noninvasive ventilation to stave off an intubation, or the use of invamucus and phlegm in the lungs, Coleman said. "The fact Francis has not been intubated

during this hospitalisation. It's not clear if he has provided any advance directives about the limits of his care if he declines or loses consciousness. Catholic teaching holds that life must be defended from conception until natural death. It insists that chronically ill patients, including those in vegetative states, must receive "ordinary" care such as hydration and nutrition, but "extraordinary" or disproportionate care can be suspended if it is no longer beneficial or is only prolonging a precarious and painful life

Francis articulated that in a 2017 speech to a meeting of the Vatican's bioethics think tank, the Pontifical Academy for Life. He said there was "no obligation to have recourse in

all circumstances to every pos sible remedy." He added: "It thus makes possible a decision that is morally qualified as withdrawal of overzealous treatment."

Archbishop Vincenzo Paglia, who heads the academy which helps articulate the Ćatholic Church's position on end-of-life care, said Francis is like any other Catholic and would follow church teaching if it came to that

Today the pope is giving us an extraordinary teaching on fragility," he told reporters Monday. "Today the pope, not through words but with his body, is reminding all of us, we elderly people to begin with, that we are all fragile and therefore we need to take care of each other."

EU ponders 800 bn euro plan to beef up defences

The chief of the European Union's executive on Tuesday proposed an 800 bil-lion-euro (USD 841 billion) plan to beef up the defences of EU nations, aiming to lessen the impact of potential US disengagement and provide Ukraine with military muscle to negotiate with Russia following the freeze of US aid to the embattled nation.

European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said the massive "REARM Europe" package will be put to the 27 EU leaders. They are holding an emergency meeting in Brussels on Thursday following a week of increasing polit-ical uncertainty from Washington, where President Donald Trump questioned both his alliance to the continent and the defence of Ukraine.

"I do not need to describe the grave nature of the threats that we face," von der Leven said. Her plan had already been in the works before Trump's decision early Tuesday to pause

military aid to Ukraine. Key to the quandary of EU nations has been an unwillingness to spend much on defence over the past decades as they hid under the US nuclear umbrella and were hurt by a sluggish economy, which creates challenges for a quick ramp-up of such spending. It increasingly has left them on the world's diplomatic sidelines. How it would work: Most of the money Von der Leyen is talking about, would come from loosening the fiscal con-straints the EU puts on bud-getary spending to "allow

Boost in defence spending coming amid China threats: Taiwan

Taipei (PTI): Taiwan's defence minister says the island is planning to boost military spending in the face of the "rapidly changing interna-tional situation and the escalating threats from adversaries.

Wellington Koo gave no fig-ures but said President William Lai Ching-te was working with the ministry in consideration of enemy threats and urgent readiness needs, a reference to China's threats t invade the island, which it considers its own territory. Those would "increase the proportion of the defence budget in relation to GDP," Koo said, in comments Monday that were embargoed until Tuesday. Taiwan currently spends about 2.45% of its gross domestic product on its military. "At the same time, in coordination with national security and foreign policy, the military will continue to deepen coop eration with the United States and other allied nations. expanding multilateral military exchanges to jointly uphold regional peace and stability," Koo said. Taiwan sees a growing threat from China, which regularly sends ships and aircraft into areas near Taiwan. China is expected to announce its annual defence budget on Wednesday Xinhua, China's state-run news agency, reported that senior Chinese official Wang Huning during an annual meeting about Taiwan had called for China to take the initiative in cross-strait relations and push toward the "reunification of the motherland? The government in Taipei condemned China's military exercises on Thursday after Beijing designated an area to conduct shooting drills off the self-governed island's southwest coast. Along with the latest equipment, the military is seeking funds to increase retention of service people through higher pay, and will need additional funds to accommodate a lengthening of compulsory national service from four months to one year. United States President Donald Trump has also demanded the self-governing island democracy that relies on the US for much of its cutting-edge weaponry, increase defence spending to up to 10 per cent of GDP, a proportion well above what the US or any of its major allies spend.

Kim's sister threatens response to US carrier deployment in S Korea

m he\ powerful\ sister\ of}$ Jong Un on Tuesday threat-ened to launch high-profile provocations in response to the arrival of a US aircraft carrier in South Korea and other US military activities, which she slammed as "confrontation hysteria of the US and its stooges".

The warning by Kim Yo Jong implies North Korea will likely ramp up weapons testing activities and maintain its confrontational posture against the US, though President Donald Trump has said he would reach out to Kim Jong Un to revive diplomacy.

In a statement carried by state media, Kim Yo Jong accused the US of clearly showing "its most hostile and confrontational will" to North Korea with the deployments of the USS Carl Vinson and other powerful US military assets and US-South Korean military drills this year. "The DPRK is also planning

to carefully examine the

option for increasing the actions threatening the security of the enemy at the strategic level to cope with the fact that the deployment of US strategic assets in the Korean Peninsula has become a vicious habit and adversely affects the security of the DPRK," she said, using the acronym of North Korea's official name, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. Her statement suggests North Korea may test-launch intercontinental ballistic missiles designed to strike the mainland US or other powerful

military bases in the region, observers say. South Korea's Defence Ministry warned later it's ready to repel any provocations by North Korea based on a solid military alliance with the US. A ministry statement called Kim Yo Jong's statement "sophistry" meant to justify its nuclear development and future provocations.

On Sunday, the USS Carl Vinson and its strike group arrived in South Korea, the latest temporary deployment

of a US strategic asset aimed at displaying the firmness of the US-South Korean military alliance in the face of North Korean threats and boosting interoperability of the allies combined assets. The US carrier's arrival came four days after North Korea conducted cruise missiles, its fourth missile test event this year.

North Korea views arrivals of such powerful US military assets in South Korea as major security threats and often responds with missile tests. North Korea hasn't directly responded to Trump's overture but alleged US-led hostilities against North Korea have intensified since the start of Trump's second term in January.

Experts say Kim Jong Un won't likely embrace Trump's outreach anytime soon as he is now focusing on his support of Russia's war against Ukraine with supply of weapons and troops. They say Kim could consider returning to diplomacy with Trump when he thinks he cannot maintain his country's current booming cooperation with Russia.

New model bilateral investment treaty tailored for global investment trends: CEA

PTI NEW DELHI

hief Economic Adviser V CAnantha Nageswaran on Tuesday said the new model text for bilateral investment treaty (BIT) will be better aligned to the demands of a dynamic global investment environment, while safeguarding India's sovereign

rights and regulatory space. Addressing a post Budget webinar 2025 on the theme of 'Making India Investment Friendly', he said the BIT framework is being revised to reflect modern challenges.

Almost 10 years have passed since the last review of India's model BIT and since then, the global investment ecosystem and international jurisprudence have evolved significantly, he said. Nageswaran said investors now

seek stronger protection for their investments, especially in emerging economies, and this has necessitated an update of the model BIT to align it with international norms, while ensuring that the country remains an attractive investment destination, for especially medium enterprises.

"The new model BIT therefore will be more attuned to the demands of a dynamic global investment environment. At the same time, we will reflect India's sovereign rights and the importance of regulatory space so that public policy priorities are not constrained by international legal obligations," Nageswaran said. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in her 2025-26 Budget speech said that to

investment and in the spirit of 'first develop India', the current model BIT will be revamped and made more investorfriendly. The announcement assumes

significance as only a few countries have accepted the existing model tax treaty, and most of the developed nations have expressed their reservations on the tax with regard to provisions like

resolution of disputes. Nageswaran also said that foreign investment plays a crucial role in the economic growth and development, and "we are a current account deficit (CAD) country, so we need both portfolio and direct investments".

The government has slapped a penalty on a unit of Reliance Industries Limited for failing to meet the deadline for setting up a battery cell plant for which it was granted production-linked incentives, the firm said on Tuesday. In a stock exchange filing,

Reliance said its step-down subsidiary, Reliance New Energy Battery Storage Ltd on March 3 received "a letter from the Ministry of Heavy Industries levying liquidated damages at the rate of 0.1 per cent of the performance security (₹50 Crore) for each day of delay from January 1, 2025.

The penalty was for the "delay in achievement of milestone one under the programme agreement executed with MHI in connection with five GWh manufacturing capacity under awarded the Performance-Linked Incentive Scheme for Advanced Chemistry Cell," it said.

The liquidated damages or penalty computed till March 3, 2025 was ₹3.1 Crore. "RNEBSL has requested for an

extension of time for achievement of the said milestone one," it said. The firm, however, neither disclosed the reasons for the delay nor the new timelines for meeting the target.

Led by Mitchell Santner, New Zealand finished behind India in Group A, while South Africa topped Group B ahead of

But there is little to separate the two sides. Both are evenlymatched in most departments but the Proteas look to be slightly ahead on the bowling front because of variety. The two teams have enough

firepower in their batting line-ups and have quality fielders but the contest is expected to be decid-

ed by the spinners. Although the pitches here are a bit on the slower side but they haven't spun as much as the surfaces in Dubai and it will be inter-

esting to see how the spinners of both the teams fare.

The 44-run loss to India in their last group match notwithstanding, New Zealand will take confidence from their win over South Africa in the tri-series here last month.

Recently, New Zealand successfully chased 305 against South Africa here and then went on to win the tri-series, beating Pakistan in the final, and senior batter Tom Latham feels those experiences will hold them in good stead.

Yeah, the (South Africa) team that we played potentially will be slightly different, they had a lot of guys that that weren't in that side. They were still playing in their SAT20 back in South Africa so will be slightly different. "But I guess from our point of

view, we'll lean back on those experiences of Lahore in playing against South Africa," Latham had said.

"We'll do everything that we do leading up to a game. It's obviously going to be a reasonably quick turnaround, but it is what it is. And, we'll be looking forward to the challenge of a semifinal," he added referring to the hectic trav-el schedule. New Zealand were in Dubai on Sunday to play against India and headed to Lahore the next morning.

Latham has been New Zealand's best batter so far with 187 runs from three matches, but Kane Williamson's return to form with a classy 81 against India also augurs well for the Kiwis.

On the bowling front, Matt Henry stood out and is currently the highest wicket-taker with eight scalps and has good support from Will O'Rourke (six wickets). In skipper Mitchell Santner, Michael Bracewell, Rachin Ravindra, Glenn Phillips and Mark Chapman, New Zealand boast of a good spin attack.

South Africa too are in red-hot form. The Proteas have fielded one of their most prolific squads in the tournament and have all their bases covered
